# EXECUTIVE DOCUMENTS

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Under authority granted by the Utah Constitution and various federal and state statutes, the Governor periodically issues **EXECUTIVE DOCUMENTS**, which can be categorized as either Executive Orders, Proclamations, and Declarations. Executive Orders set policy for the executive branch; create boards and commissions; provide for the transfer of authority; or otherwise interpret, implement, or give administrative effect to a provision of the Constitution, state law or executive policy. Proclamations call special or extraordinary legislative sessions; designate classes of cities; publish states-of-emergency; promulgate other official formal public announcements or functions; or publicly avow or cause certain matters of state government to be made generally known. Declarations designate special days, weeks or other time periods; call attention to or recognize people, groups, organizations, functions, or similar actions having a public purpose; or invoke specific legislative purposes (such as the declaration of an agricultural disaster).

The Governor's Office staff files **EXECUTIVE DOCUMENTS** that have legal effect with the Office of Administrative Rules for publication and distribution.

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## Wildland Fire Management, Utah Exec. Order No. 2018-5

### EXECUTIVE ORDER

#### Wildland Fire Management

**WHEREAS**, the danger from wildland fires is high throughout the State of Utah;

**WHEREAS**, wildfires are currently burning in some areas of the State;

**WHEREAS**, fire restrictions and wildfire warnings are in place across the State;

**WHEREAS**, counties in the Southeastern corner of the State have made drought declarations;

**WHEREAS**, extreme hot temperatures are forecasted throughout the State;

**WHEREAS**, some of the areas are extremely remote and inaccessible and the situation has the potential to greatly worsen if left unattended;

**WHEREAS**, immediate action will be required to suppress fires and mitigate post burn flash floods to protect public safety, property, natural resources and the environment should these dangerous conditions escalate to active wildfires;

**WHEREAS**, these conditions do create the potential for a disaster emergency within the scope of the Disaster Response and Recovery Act of 1981;

**NOW THEREFORE**, I, Gary R. Herbert, Governor of the State of Utah by virtue of the power vested in me by the constitution and the laws of the State of Utah, do hereby order that:

It is found, determined and declared that a "State of Emergency" exists Statewide due to the threat to public safety, property, critical infrastructure, natural resources and the environment, effective for the month of August 2018, requiring aid, assistance and relief available pursuant to the provisions of state statutes, and the State Emergency Operations Plan, which is hereby activated.

IN TESTIMONY, WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused to be affixed the Great Seal of the State of Utah this 1st day of August 2018.

## NOTICES OF PROPOSED RULES

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A state agency may file a **PROPOSED RULE** when it determines the need for a substantive change to an existing rule. With a **NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE**, an agency may create a new rule, amend an existing rule, repeal an existing rule, or repeal an existing rule and reenact a new rule. Filings received between July 17, 2018, 12:00 a.m., and August 01, 2018, 11:59 p.m. are included in this, the August 15, 2018, issue of the *Utah State Bulletin*.

In this publication, each **PROPOSED RULE** is preceded by a **RULE ANALYSIS**. This analysis provides summary information about the **PROPOSED RULE** including the name of a contact person, anticipated cost impact of the rule, and legal cross-references.

Following the **RULE ANALYSIS**, the text of the **PROPOSED RULE** is usually printed. New rules or additions made to existing rules are underlined (example). Deletions made to existing rules are struck out with brackets surrounding them (~~example~~). Rules being repealed are completely struck out. A row of dots in the text between paragraphs (. . . . .) indicates that unaffected text from within a section was removed to conserve space. Unaffected sections are not usually printed. If a **PROPOSED RULE** is too long to print, the Office of Administrative Rules may include only the **RULE ANALYSIS**. A copy of each rule that is too long to print is available from the filing agency or from the Office of Administrative Rules.

The law requires that an agency accept public comment on **PROPOSED RULES** published in this issue of the *Utah State Bulletin* until at least September 14, 2018. The agency may accept comment beyond this date and will indicate the last day the agency will accept comment in the **RULE ANALYSIS**. The agency may also hold public hearings. Additionally, citizens or organizations may request the agency hold a hearing on a specific **PROPOSED RULE**. Section 63G-3-302 requires that a hearing request be received by the agency proposing the rule "in writing not more than 15 days after the publication date of the proposed rule."

From the end of the public comment period through December 13, 2018, the agency may notify the Office of Administrative Rules that it wants to make the **PROPOSED RULE** effective. The agency sets the effective date. The date may be no fewer than seven calendar days after the close of the public comment period nor more than 120 days after the publication date of this issue of the *Utah State Bulletin*. Alternatively, the agency may file a **CHANGE IN PROPOSED RULE** in response to comments received. If the Office of Administrative Rules does not receive a **NOTICE OF EFFECTIVE DATE OF A CHANGE IN PROPOSED RULE**, the **PROPOSED RULE** lapses.

The public, interest groups, and governmental agencies are invited to review and comment on **PROPOSED RULES**. *Comment may be directed to the contact person identified on the **RULE ANALYSIS** for each rule.*

**PROPOSED RULES** are governed by Section 63G-3-301, Rule R15-2, and Sections R15-4-3, R15-4-4, R15-4-5a, R15-4-9, and R15-4-10.

**RULE ANALYSIS**

**PURPOSE OF THE RULE OR REASON FOR THE CHANGE:** These changes add better clarification and increases the limit for incidental reimbursements for ground transportation gratuities and tips, for state employees when traveling on state business. Other nonsubstantive changes are also made.

**SUMMARY OF THE RULE OR CHANGE:** These amendments change the amount that can be reimbursed for tips for ground transportation, and gives employees different options of submitting reimbursement requests.

**STATUTORY OR CONSTITUTIONAL AUTHORIZATION FOR THIS RULE:** Section 63A-3-106 and Section 63A-3-107

**ANTICIPATED COST OR SAVINGS TO:**

- ◆ **THE STATE BUDGET:** There will potentially be an increased cost to the state as reimbursements for incidentals may increase.
- ◆ **LOCAL GOVERNMENTS:** There may be costs to local governments that are required to follow this rule.
- ◆ **SMALL BUSINESSES:** Small businesses will not see an increase in revenue.
- ◆ **PERSONS OTHER THAN SMALL BUSINESSES, BUSINESSES, OR LOCAL GOVERNMENTAL ENTITIES:** Individuals eligible for reimbursement may see an increase in their reimbursement for ground transportation tips.

**COMPLIANCE COSTS FOR AFFECTED PERSONS:** Because these amendments change reimbursement rates for ground transportation tips and do not require any new actions on the part of the persons applying for reimbursements, there are no compliance costs.

**COMMENTS BY THE DEPARTMENT HEAD ON THE FISCAL IMPACT THE RULE MAY HAVE ON BUSINESSES:** I have reviewed these changes with the Division of Finance Director and believe these changes are reasonable and warranted.

**Appendix 2: Regulatory Impact to Non-Small Businesses**  
 The object codes used to categorize the tip changes is a broader "ground transportation" object code. Because of that, the Division of Finance will not be able to break apart mileage reimbursement from taxi/rideshare fees from transportation tips without an analysis of every transaction over a broad time period.

**R25. Administrative Services, Finance.**  
**R25-7. Travel-Related Reimbursements for State Employees.**  
**R25-7-8. Reimbursement for Lodging.**

State employees who travel on state business may be eligible for a lodging reimbursement.

(1) For stays at a conference hotel, the state will reimburse the actual cost plus tax and any mandatory fees charged by the hotel for both in-state and out-of-state travel. The traveler must include the conference registration brochure with the Travel Reimbursement Request, form FI 51A, ~~or~~ FI 51B, or ESS Travel.

(2) For in-state lodging at a non-conference hotel, the state will reimburse the actual cost up to \$70 per night for single occupancy plus tax and any mandatory fees charged by the hotel except as noted in the table below:

(3) State employees traveling less than 50 miles from their home base are not entitled to lodging reimbursement. Miles are calculated from either the departure home-base or from the destination to the traveler's home-base. The traveler may leave from one home-base and return to a different home-base. For example, if the traveler leaves from their residence, then the home-base for departure calculations is their residence. If the traveler returns to where they normally work (ie. Cannon Health Building), then the home-base for arrival calculations is the Cannon Health Building.

(a) In some cases, agencies must use ~~judgement~~ judgment to determine a traveler's home-base. The following are some things to consider when determining a traveler's home-base.

(i) Is the destination less than 50 miles from the traveler's home or normal work location? If the destination is less than 50 miles from either the traveler's home or from their normal work location, then generally the employee should not be reimbursed for lodging.

(ii) Is there a valid business reason for the traveler to go to the office (or to some other location) before driving to the destination?

(iii) Is the traveler required to work at the destination the next day?

(iv) Is the traveler going directly home after the trip, or is there a valid business reason for the traveler to first go to the office (or to some other location)?

(v) Even if "it is not specifically against policy", would the lodging be considered necessary, reasonable and in the best interest of the State?

(4) When the State of Utah pays for a person from out-of-state to travel to Utah, the in-state lodging per diem rates will apply.

(5) For out-of-state travel stays at a non-conference hotel, the state will reimburse the actual cost per night plus tax and any mandatory fees charged by the hotel, not to exceed the federal lodging rate for the location. These reservations must be made through the State Travel Office.

(6) The state will reimburse the actual cost per night plus tax and any mandatory fees charged by the hotel for in-state or out-of-state travel stays where the department/traveler makes reservations through the State Travel Office.

If lodging is not available at the allowable per diem rate in the area the employee needs to stay, the State Travel Office will book a hotel with the best available rate. In this circumstance, the employee will be reimbursed at the actual rate booked.

If an employee chooses to stay at a hotel that costs more than the allowable per diem rate, the employee will only be reimbursed for the allowable per diem rate plus tax and any mandatory fees charged by the hotel. These instances will be audited 100% by the State Finance Post-Auditors.

(7) Lodging is reimbursed at the rates listed in Table 5 for single occupancy only. For double state employee occupancy, add \$20, for triple state employee occupancy, add \$40, for quadruple state employee occupancy, add \$60.

(8) Exceptions will be allowed for unusual circumstances when approved in writing by the traveler's Department Director or designee prior to the trip.

(a) For out-of-state travel, the approval may be on the form FI 5.

(b) Attach the written approval to the Travel Reimbursement Request, form FI 51B, ~~or~~ FI 51D, or ESS Travel.

(9) A proper receipt for lodging accommodations must accompany each request for reimbursement.

A proper receipt is a copy of the registration form generally used by motels and hotels which includes the following information: name of motel/hotel, street address, town and state, telephone number, current date, name of person/persons staying at the motel/hotel, date(s) of occupancy, amount and date paid, number in the party, and (single, double, triple, or quadruple occupancy).

(10) When lodging is required, travelers should stay at the lodging facility nearest to the meeting/training/work location where state lodging per diem rates are accepted in order to minimize transportation costs.

(11) Travelers may also elect to stay with friends or relatives or use their personal campers or trailer homes instead of staying in a hotel.

(a) With proof of staying overnight away from home on approved state business, the traveler will be reimbursed the following:

(i) \$25 per night with no receipts required or

(ii) Actual cost up to \$40 per night with a signed receipt from a facility such as a campground or trailer park, not from a private residence.

(12) Travelers who are on assignment away from their home base for longer than 90 days will be reimbursed as follows:

(a) First 30 days - follow regular rules for lodging and meals. Lodging receipt is required.

(b) After 30 days - \$46 per day for lodging and meals. No receipt is required.

#### **R25-7-9. Reimbursement for Incidentals.**

State employees who travel on state business may be eligible for a reimbursement for incidental expenses.

(1) Travelers will be reimbursed for actual out-of-pocket costs for incidental items such as baggage tips, ~~transportation costs,~~ maid service, and bellman. Gratuities/tips for various services such as ~~taxi/shuttle,~~ assistance with baggage, maid service, and bellman, may be reimbursed up to a combined maximum of \$5.00 per day.

~~(a) Tips for doormen and meals are not reimbursable.~~

~~(b) No other gratuities will be reimbursed.~~

~~(c)~~ (a) Include an original receipt for each individual incidental item above \$19.99.

(2) The state will reimburse incidental ground transportation and parking expenses.

(a) Travelers shall document all official business use of taxi, bus, parking, and other ground transportation including dates, destinations, parking locations, receipts, and amounts.

(b) Personal use of such transportation to restaurants is not reimbursable.

(c) The maximum that airport parking will be reimbursed is the economy lot parking rate at the airport they are flying out of. A receipt is required for amounts of \$20 or more.

(d) Gratuities/Tips for ground transportation (taxi/shuttle/rideshare) will be reimbursed up to the greater of \$5 or 18% for each ride. Gratuities/Tips must be shown on an original receipt.

(3) Registration should be paid in advance on a state warrant, or with a state purchasing card.

(a) A copy of the approved FI 5 form must be included with the Payment Voucher for out-of-state registrations.

(b) If a traveler must pay the registration when they arrive, the agency is expected to process a Payment Voucher and have the traveler take the state warrant with them.

(4) Telephone calls related to state business are reimbursed at the actual cost.

(a) The traveler shall list the amount of these calls separately on the Travel Reimbursement Request, form FI 51A, ~~or~~ FI 51B, or ESS Travel.

(b) The traveler must provide an original lodging receipt or original personal phone bill showing the phone number called and the dollar amount for business telephone calls and personal telephone calls.

(5) Allowances for personal telephone calls made while out of town on state business overnight may be based on the number of nights away from home. The traveler must provide an original lodging receipt or original personal phone bill showing the phone number called and the dollar amount for personal telephone calls.

(a) Four nights or less - actual amount up to \$2.50 per night.

(b) Five to eleven nights - actual amount up to \$20.00

(c) Twelve nights to thirty nights - actual amount up to \$30.00

(d) More than thirty days - start over

(6) Actual laundry expenses up to \$18.00 per week will be allowed for trips in excess of six consecutive nights, beginning after the sixth night out.

(a) The traveler must provide receipts for the laundry expense.

(b) For use of coin-operated laundry facilities, the traveler must provide a list of dates, locations, and amounts.

(7) An amount of \$5 per day will be allowed for travelers away in excess of six consecutive nights beginning after the sixth night out.

(a) This amount covers miscellaneous incidentals not covered in this rule.

(b) This allowance is not available for travelers going to conferences.

(8) Travel on a Weekend during Trips of More Than 10 Nights' Duration - A department may provide for employees to return home on a weekend when a trip extends longer than ten nights. Reimbursements may be given for costs allowed by these policies.

#### **R25-7-10. Reimbursement for Transportation.**

State employees who travel on state business may be eligible for a transportation reimbursement.

(1) Air transportation is limited to Air Coach or Excursion class. Priority seating charges will not be reimbursed unless preapproved by the department director or designee.

(a) All reservations (in-state and out-of-state) should be made through the State Travel Office for the least expensive air fare available at the time reservations are made.

(b) Only one change fee per trip will be reimbursed.

(c) The explanation for the change and any other exception to this rule must be given and approved by the Department Director or designee.

(2) Travelers may be reimbursed for mileage to and from the airport and long-term parking or away-from-the-airport parking.

(a) The maximum reimbursement for parking, whether travelers park at the airport or away from the airport, is the long term parking rate at the airport they are flying out of.

(b) The parking receipt must be included with the Travel Reimbursement Request, form FI 51A, ~~FI 51B~~, or ESS Travel for amounts of \$20 or more.

(c) Travelers may be reimbursed, up to the maximum reimbursements rate, for mileage to and from the airport to allow someone to drop them off and to pick them up.

(3) Travelers may use private vehicles with approval from the Department Director or designee.

(a) Only one person in a vehicle may receive the reimbursement, regardless of the number of people in the vehicle.

(b) Reimbursement for a private vehicle will be at the rate of 42 cents per mile or 54 cents per mile if a state vehicle is not available to the employee.

(i) To determine which rate to use, the traveler must first determine if their department has an agency vehicle (long-term leased vehicle from Fleet Operations) that meets their needs and is reasonably available for the trip (does not apply to special purpose vehicles). If reasonably available, the employee should use an agency vehicle. If an agency vehicle that meets their needs is not reasonably available, the agency may approve the traveler to use either a daily pool fleet vehicle or a private vehicle. If a daily pool fleet vehicle is not reasonably available, the traveler may be reimbursed at 54 cents per mile.

(ii) If a trip is estimated to average 100 miles or more per day, the agency should approve the traveler to rent a daily pool fleet vehicle if one is reasonably available. Doing so will cost less than if the traveler takes a private vehicle. If the agency approves the traveler to take a private vehicle, the employee will be reimbursed at the lower rate of 42 cents per mile.

(c) Agencies may establish a reimbursement rate that is more restrictive than the rate established in this Section.

(d) Any exceptions to this mileage reimbursement rate guidance must be approved in writing by the employees Executive Director or designee.

(e) Mileage will be computed using Mapquest or other generally accepted map/route planning website, or from the latest official state road map and will be limited to the most economical, usually traveled routes.

(f) If the traveler uses a private vehicle on official state business and is reimbursed for mileage, parking charges may be reimbursed as an incidental expense.

(g) An approved Private Vehicle Usage Report, form FI 40, should be included with the department's payroll documentation reporting miles driven on state business during the payroll period.

(h) Departments may allow mileage reimbursement on an approved Travel Reimbursement Request, form FI 51A, ~~FI 51B~~, or ESS Travel, if other costs associated with the trip are to be reimbursed at the same time.

(4) A traveler may choose to drive instead of flying if preapproved by the Department Director or designee.

(a) If the traveler drives a state-owned vehicle, the traveler may be reimbursed for meals and lodging for a reasonable amount of travel time; however, the total cost of the trip must not exceed the equivalent cost of the airline trip. The traveler may also be reimbursed for incidental expenses such as toll fees and parking fees.

(b) If the traveler drives a privately-owned vehicle, reimbursement will be at the rate of 42 cents per mile or the airplane fare, whichever is less, unless otherwise approved by the Department Director or designee.

(i) The lowest fare available within 30 days prior to the departure date will be used when calculating the cost of travel for comparison to private vehicle cost.

(ii) A comparison printout which is available through the State Travel Office is required when the traveler is taking a private vehicle.

(iii) The traveler may be reimbursed for meals and lodging for a reasonable amount of travel time; however, the total cost of the trip must not exceed the equivalent cost of an airline trip.

(iv) If the traveler uses a private vehicle on official state business and is reimbursed for mileage, parking charges may be reimbursed as an incidental expense.

(c) When submitting the reimbursement form, attach a schedule comparing the cost of driving with the cost of flying. The schedule should show that the total cost of the trip driving was less than or equal to the total cost of the trip flying.

(d) If the travel time taken for driving during the employee's normal work week is greater than that which would have occurred had the employee flown, the excess time used will be taken as annual leave and deducted on the Time and Attendance System.

(5) Use of rental vehicles must be approved in writing in advance by the Department Director or designee.

(a) An exception to advance approval of the use of rental vehicles shall be fully explained in writing with the request for reimbursement and approved by the Department Director or designee.

(b) Detailed explanation is required if a rental vehicle is requested for a traveler staying at a conference hotel.

(c) When making rental car arrangements through the State Travel Office, reserve the vehicle you need. Upgrades in size or model made when picking up the rental vehicle will not be reimbursed.

(i) State employees should rent vehicles to be used for state business in their own names, using the state contract so they will have full coverage under the state's liability insurance.

(ii) Rental vehicle reservations not made through the State Travel Office must be approved in advance by the Department Director or designee.

(iii) The traveler will be reimbursed the actual rate charged by the rental agency.

(iv) The traveler must have approval for a rental car in order to be reimbursed for rental car parking.

(6) Travel by private airplane must be approved in advance by the Department Director or designee.

(a) The pilot must certify to the Department Director or designee that the pilot is certified to fly the plane being used for state business.

(b) If the plane is owned by the pilot/employee, the pilot must certify the existence of at least \$500,000 of liability insurance coverage.

(c) If the plane is a rental, the pilot must provide written certification from the rental agency that the insurance covers the traveler and the state as insured. The insurance must be adequate to cover any physical damage to the plane and at least \$500,000 for liability coverage.

(d) Reimbursement will be made at 53 cents per mile.

(e) Mileage calculation is based on air mileage and is limited to the most economical, usually-traveled route.

(7) Travel by private motorcycle must be approved prior to the trip by the Department Director or designee. Travel will be reimbursed at 20 cents per mile.

(8) A car allowance may be allowed in lieu of mileage reimbursement in certain cases. Prior written approval from the Department Director, the Executive Director of the Department of Administrative Services, and the Governor is required.

**RULE ANALYSIS**

**PURPOSE OF THE RULE OR REASON FOR THE CHANGE:** The purpose of this proposed rule section is to provide notice and information to appraisal management companies (AMCs) registered in Utah that the Division of Real Estate (Division) will be collecting and transmitting to the Appraisal Subcommittee the federal AMC registry fee. This new section implements H.B. 243 from the 2018 General Session.

**SUMMARY OF THE RULE OR CHANGE:** The AMC registry fee is a new federal fee established by the Appraisal Subcommittee which is collected by each state AMC regulatory agency. In Utah, the regulatory agency is the Division. The Division will collect the AMC registry fee from AMCs and transmit the fees to the Appraisal Subcommittee.

**STATUTORY OR CONSTITUTIONAL AUTHORIZATION FOR THIS RULE:** Section 61-2e-103 and Section 61-2e-205

**ANTICIPATED COST OR SAVINGS TO:**

♦ **THE STATE BUDGET:** The Division has the staff and budget in place to administer this proposed amendment. After conducting a thorough analysis, it was determined that this proposed rule amendment will not result in a fiscal impact, affect those resources, or result in any additional cost or savings to the state budget.

♦ **LOCAL GOVERNMENTS:** Local governments are not required to comply with or enforce the Appraisal Management Company Registration and Regulation rules. After conducting a thorough analysis, it was determined that this proposed rule amendment will not result in a fiscal impact to local governments.

♦ **SMALL BUSINESSES:** Only small businesses that are AMCs registered in Utah, or are operated as a subsidiary of a federally-regulated financial institution are subject to payment of the AMC registry fee. After conducting a thorough analysis, it was determined that this proposed rule amendment will not result in a fiscal impact to small businesses, except for the affected AMCs. The compliance

cost for AMCs affected by this proposed rule amendment is estimated under compliance costs for affected persons below.  
**◆ PERSONS OTHER THAN SMALL BUSINESSES, BUSINESSES, OR LOCAL GOVERNMENTAL ENTITIES:** Only AMCs registered in Utah, or that operate in Utah as a subsidiary of a federally-regulated financial institution are subject to payment of the AMC registry fee. After conducting a thorough analysis, it was determined that this proposed rule amendment will not result in a fiscal impact to persons other than small businesses, businesses, or local government entities, except for the affected AMCs. The compliance cost for AMCs affected by this proposed rule amendment is estimated under compliance costs for affected persons below.

**COMPLIANCE COSTS FOR AFFECTED PERSONS:** This proposed amendment provides for the collection and transmittal of the AMC registry fee. The AMC registry fee is a new federal requirement for AMCs registered in Utah, or operating in Utah as a subsidiary of a federally-regulated financial institution. The Division only collects the fee and transmits it to the Appraisal Subcommittee. After conducting a thorough analysis, it was determined that the AMC registry fee will result in a combined fiscal impact to affected AMCs of \$80,000 per year.

**COMMENTS BY THE DEPARTMENT HEAD ON THE FISCAL IMPACT THE RULE MAY HAVE ON BUSINESSES:** This new rule implements H.B. 243 (2018) which provides that the federally-mandated AMC registry fee shall be collected by the Division and transmitted to the appropriate federal agency. The AMC registry fee is a new federal requirement for AMCs registered in Utah, or operating in Utah as a subsidiary of a federally-regulated financial institution. The Division only collects the fee and transmits it to the Appraisal Subcommittee. After conducting a thorough analysis, the Division determined that the AMC registry fee will result in a combined fiscal impact to affected Utah AMCs of \$80,000 per year. There are an estimated 34 large businesses in the AMC industry (NAICS) operating in Utah. These businesses account for an estimated 25% of the total number of AMC registry fees required to be paid to the federal Appraisal Subcommittee per year. The estimated remaining 75% of the AMC registry fees will be paid by small business AMCs.

**R398-10-1. Authority and Purpose.**

(1) This rule is authorized by Subsections 26-1-30(5), (6), (7), (8), (9), 53E-9-308(6)(b), 26-5-3, 26-5-4, and 26-7-4.

(2) This rule establishes reporting requirements for autism spectrum disorder (ASD) and intellectual disability and related screening and test results in individuals.

#### **R398-10-2. Definitions.**

As used in this rule:

(1) "Autism Spectrum Disorder" or "ASD" means a pervasive developmental disorder described by the American Psychiatric Association or the World Health Organization diagnostic manuals as: Autistic disorder, Atypical autism, Asperger Syndrome, Rett Syndrome, Childhood Disintegrative Disorder, or Pervasive Developmental Disorder-Not Otherwise Specified; or a special education classification for autism or other disabilities related to autism.

(2) "Intellectual Disability" means a condition marked by an intelligence quotient of less than or equal to 70 on the most recently administered psychometric test (or for infants, a clinical judgment of significantly subaverage intellectual functioning) and concurrent deficits or impairments in adaptive functioning in at least two of the following areas: communication, self-care, home living, social and interpersonal skills, use of community resources, self-direction, functional academic skills, work, leisure, health, and safety. This condition must have its onset before age 18 years.

(3) "Qualified professional" means a medical, clinical or educational professional in a position to observe children with developmental disabilities, including, psychologists, physicians, teachers, speech/language pathologists, occupational therapists, physical therapists, nurses, and social workers.

#### **R398-10-3. Reporting by Diagnostic, ~~or~~ Treatment or Educational Facilities.**

Diagnostic, ~~or~~ treatment or educational facilities ~~that~~ which provide specialized care or individualized education programs for ASD and related disorders shall report or cause to report the following to the Department within thirty days of making an ASD diagnosis or special education classification for autism or other disabilities related to autism:

- (1) patient's name;
- (2) patient's date of birth;
- (3) patient's address;
- (4) home phone;
- (5) patient's sex;
- (6) mother's name;
- (7) mother's date of birth;
- (8) provider name;
- (9) provider degree;
- (10) provider specialty;
- (11) provider address;
- (12) provider phone number;
- (13) diagnosis of autistic disorder, atypical autism, pervasive developmental disorder-not otherwise specified, Asperger's syndrome, or special education classification ~~that~~ which makes the individual eligible to receive special education services; and

**RULE ANALYSIS**

**PURPOSE OF THE RULE OR REASON FOR THE CHANGE:** The purpose of these changes are to incorporate the July 1, 2017, version of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) which will include the incorporation of 29 CFR 1904, 29 CFR 1910.1053, and 29 CFR 1926.1153.

**SUMMARY OF THE RULE OR CHANGE:** Employers in certain industries will be required to electronically submit injury and illness data that employers are already required to keep under existing regulations. The frequency and content of these establishment-specific submissions is set out in this rule and is dependent on the size and industry of the employer. This amended rule (29 CFR 1904) will contain updated requirements on how employers inform employees to report work-related injuries and illnesses to their employer. It also requires employers to inform employees of their right to report work-related injuries and illnesses free from retaliation; clarifies the existing implicit requirement that an employer's procedure for reporting work-related injuries and illnesses must be reasonable and not deter or discourage employees from reporting; and prohibits employers from retaliating against employees for reporting work-related injuries or illnesses. This amended rule clarifies the rights of employees and their representatives to access the injury and illness records. 29 CFR 1910.1053 and 29 CFR 1926.1153 are new respirable crystalline silica standards. These standards will have a lower permissible exposure limit (PEL) of 50 micrograms of respirable crystalline silica per cubic meter of air, averaged over an 8-hour day, in both general industry and construction, as compared to the previous PELs which were approximately equivalent to 100 micrograms per cubic meter for general industry and 250 micrograms/m<sup>3</sup> for construction. These standards will also contain an action level of 25 micrograms per cubic meter, averaged over an 8-hour day, and associated ancillary requirements. These incorporated standards will contain provisions for measuring how much silica workers are exposed to, limiting workers' access to areas where silica exposures are high, using effective methods for reducing exposures, providing medical exams to workers, establishing and implementing control plans, and training workers about silica-related hazards and how to limit exposure.

- ◆ **SMALL BUSINESSES:** 29 CFR 1910.1053 and 29 CFR 1926.1153: anticipated fiscal cost = \$7,188,456; anticipated fiscal benefit = \$224,516,539; and net fiscal benefit = \$217,328,083. 29 CFR 1904: amendments to this rule will not have a significant economic impact on a substantial number of small businesses. It does not add to or change any employers' obligation to complete, retain, and certify

injury and illness records and does not add to or change the recording criteria or definitions for these records. The only changes are that, under certain circumstances, employers will be obligated to submit information from these records in an electronic format and to assure that employees have, and understand that they have, a right to report injuries and illnesses without fear of discrimination. The electronic submission of information would be a relatively simple and quick matter. In most cases, submitting information would require several basic steps: 1) logging on to OSHA's web-based submission system; 2) entering basic establishment information into the system (the first time only); 3) copying the required injury and illness information from the establishments' records into the electronic submission forms; and 4) hitting a button to submit the information to OSHA. - ◆ **PERSONS OTHER THAN SMALL BUSINESSES, BUSINESSES, OR LOCAL GOVERNMENTAL ENTITIES:** 29 CFR 1910.1053 and 29 CFR 1926.1153: aggregate anticipated cost or saving to large businesses: anticipated fiscal cost = \$1,127,278; anticipated fiscal benefit = \$9,710,767; and net fiscal benefit = \$8,583,489. Other parties that will benefit from the adoption of the silica standard are manufacturers and vendors whose services will be needed for employers to comply with the silica standard, such as controls, respiratory protection and programs, medical surveillance, control plans, regulated areas (general industry only) and training. The fiscal benefit is \$7,321,704. 29 CFR 1904: amendments to this rule will not have a significant economic impact on a substantial number of large entities. It does not add to or change any employers' obligation to complete, retain, and certify injury and illness records and does not add to or change the recording criteria or definitions for these records. The only changes are that, under certain circumstances, employers will be obligated to submit information from these records in an electronic format and to assure that employees have, and understand that they have, a right to report injuries and illnesses without fear of discrimination. The electronic submission of information would be a relatively simple and quick matter. COMPLIANCE COSTS FOR AFFECTED PERSONS: 29 CFR 1910.1053 and 29 CFR 1926.1153: the cost depends on the nature of the business and ranges from \$295 for NAICS 238200 (Building Equipment Contractors) to \$220,558 for NAICS 213112 (Support Services for Oil and Gas Operations). Below is an estimate of the median cost per an affected non-small businesses, small businesses, and local governments. The median annualized cost per an affected large establishment is \$1,352. The median annualized cost per an affected small business is \$1,200. The median annualized cost per an affected local government "establishment" as a result of incorporating the silica standard is \$2,449. 29 CFR 1904: amendments to this rule will not have a significant economic impact on a substantial number of entities. It does not add to or change any employer's obligation to complete, retain, and certify injury and illness records and does not add to or change the recording criteria or definitions for these records. **Appendix 2: Regulatory Impact to Non-Small Businesses**

There is a total of 486 non-small businesses in the industries in question (60 different NAICS) with approximately 324 of these establishments affected by the adoption of the silica rule. Of these 324 establishments, 252 are in the construction industry and 72 are in general industry. For a complete listing of NAICS codes used in this analysis, please contact the agency.

In construction, the NAICS with the largest number of entities affected is 238200 (Building Equipment Contractors) at 44 with an annualized cost of \$421 per entity. NAICS 237200 (Land Subdivision) and NAICS 237900 (Other Heavy Civil Engineering Construction) have the least amount of entities affected, 1, with an annualized cost of \$912 and \$3,160, respectively. The highest annualized cost per large entity in construction is that of NAICS 237300 (Highway Street and Bridge Construction) at \$4,811. There are 28 affected large entities within this NAICS.

In general industry, the NAICS with the largest number of affected entities is 327320 (Ready-Mixed Concrete Manufacturing) at 13 with an annualized cost of \$5,580 per entity. The annualized cost in general industry ranges from \$304 (NAICS 621210, Dental Offices) per entity to \$220,558 (NAICS 213112, Support Services for Oil and Gas Operations). There are 5 affected large entities in NAICS 621210 and 1 in NAICS 213112.

The median annualized cost per an affected large establishment as a result of incorporating the silica standard is \$1,352. The annualized cost per an affected entity within the 60 NAICSs was used to determine the median.

The average annualized cost per a large establishment is \$3,479 with NAICS 213112 (Support Services for Oil and Gas Operations) at the highest (\$220,558) and NAICS 621210 (Dental Offices) at the lowest (\$304). The average cost was determined by taking the total cost and dividing by the number of affected non-small businesses.

**RULE ANALYSIS**

**PURPOSE OF THE RULE OR REASON FOR THE CHANGE:** A state safety inspection may be accepted as an annual periodic inspection for a commercial motor vehicle as required by the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA), if it is equivalent to their minimum periodic inspection standards. The "acute area" of a windshield currently defined in Rule R714-160 does not meet those minimum standards for a commercial motor vehicle. In addition, changes were made to Sections R714-160-21 and R714-160-23 in response to the passage of H.B. 265 during the 2017 General Session to correct statutory references.

**SUMMARY OF THE RULE OR CHANGE:** If a vehicle being inspected is a commercial motor vehicle, the "acute area" of a windshield means the area of a commercial vehicle windshield extending upward from the height of the top of the steering wheel, excluding a 2-inch border at the top of the windshield, and a 1-inch border at each side of the windshield or windshield panel. If the vehicle is a passenger vehicle, the "acute area" of a windshield means the area of a passenger vehicle windshield inside a 6-inch border measured from the edge of the glass where it meets the molding around the entire outside of the windshield. This definition of "acute area" of a windshield for a passenger vehicle has not changed. In addition, the reference to Subsection 53-8-

205(1)(b)(iii) was removed from Section R714-160-21 as it was removed from statute upon passage of H.B. 265 during the 2017 General Session; and the reference in Section R714-160-23 was changed from Subsection 53-8-205(3) to Subsection 53-8-205(1)(a) because the reference was not correct.

**STATUTORY OR CONSTITUTIONAL AUTHORIZATION FOR THIS RULE:** Section 41-6a-1601 and Section 53-8-204 and Section 53-8-205

**ANTICIPATED COST OR SAVINGS TO:**

◆ **THE STATE BUDGET:** This proposed amendment is not expected to have any fiscal impact on state government revenues or expenditures because the change does not affect the operating costs of the Utah Highway Patrol Safety Inspection Office.

◆ **LOCAL GOVERNMENTS:** This proposed amendment is not expected to have any fiscal impact on local governments revenues or expenditures, because vehicles owned or operated by local governments are not considered to be operating in commerce.

◆ **SMALL BUSINESSES:** Small businesses will be affected by this amendment because some will be required to have their vehicles' windshields repaired or replaced, and other small businesses will provide that service. Auto glass replacement shops and entities that operate commercial vehicles are groups that will be affected. According to the Department of Workforce Services (DWS) Firm Find Data (NAICS code 811122) there are 106 auto glass replacement shops in Utah identified as small businesses. These businesses would experience a direct benefit from this amendment as a result of damaged windshield repair or replacement sales. This benefit would be ongoing, but it would be difficult to estimate the number of windshields damaged on commercial vehicles each year that would need to be repaired or replaced by these businesses. According to the FMCSA office in Utah, there are approximately 17,462 entities that operate vehicles with a United States Department of Transportation (USDOT) number which indicates the vehicles may be used in commerce. These entities would experience a direct cost as a result of this amendment. This cost would be ongoing, but it would be difficult to estimate the number of damaged windshields an entity may be required to repair or replace during a year.

◆ **PERSONS OTHER THAN SMALL BUSINESSES, BUSINESSES, OR LOCAL GOVERNMENTAL ENTITIES:** According to the FMCSA office in Utah, there are approximately 17,462 entities that operate vehicles with a USDOT number which indicates the vehicles may be used in commerce. Some of these entities would be considered businesses and some would be considered non-profit organizations (i.e. Utah Coalition for Animals). These entities would experience a direct cost as a result of this amendment. This cost would be ongoing, but it would be difficult to estimate the number of damaged windshields an entity may be required to repair or replace during a year.

**COMPLIANCE COSTS FOR AFFECTED PERSONS:** There are no compliance costs associated with the change in this rule.

**COMMENTS BY THE DEPARTMENT HEAD ON THE FISCAL IMPACT THE RULE MAY HAVE ON BUSINESSES:** Both small and non-small businesses with employees that operate commercial vehicles will be affected by this amendment because some will be required to have their vehicles' windshields repaired or replaced in order to be in compliance. Other businesses that provide repair service and auto glass replacement shops will experience a positive fiscal impact. Both the costs associated with obtaining repairs and the cost benefit to those providing repair or glass replacement services would be ongoing, but it would be difficult to estimate the number of windshields damaged on commercial vehicles each year that would need to be repaired or replaced by these businesses. According to the FMCSA office in Utah, there are approximately 135 entities with 50 or more drivers that operate vehicles with a USDOT number which indicates the vehicles may be used in commerce. According to DWS Firm Find Data (NAICS code 811122) there are two auto glass replacement shops in Utah identified as non-small businesses. The head of the Department of Public Safety, Keith D. Squires, has reviewed and approved this fiscal analysis.

(i) the area of a passenger vehicle windshield inside a 6 inch border measured from the edge of the glass where it meets the molding around the entire outside of the windshield; or

(ii) the area of a windshield of a commercial motor vehicle as defined in the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, extending upward from the height of the top of the steering wheel, excluding a 2 inch border at the top of the windshield, and a 1 inch border at each side of the windshield or windshield panel;

(b) "CNG" means compressed natural gas;

(c) "custom vehicle" means a motor vehicle as defined in Subsection 41-6a-1507(1);

(d) "division" means the Vehicle Safety Inspection section of the Utah Highway Patrol;

(e) "GVWR" means gross vehicle weight rating;

(f) "inspector" means a person with a valid certificate who is employed by a licensed station;

(g) "lifted vehicle" means a vehicle that has been raised from the original manufacturer's frame height;

(h) "lowered vehicle" means a vehicle that has been lowered from the original manufacturer's height;

(i) "online inspection certificate" means an inspection certificate created electronically through the Vehicle Safety Inspection System;

(j) "online inspection program" means the web-based inspection program used to record safety inspections;

(k) "OEM" means original equipment manufacturer;

(l) "paper inspection certificate" means an inspection certificate created by paper form;

(m) "passenger vehicle" means a vehicle with a gross vehicle weight rating less than 26,001 pounds that transports passengers, including the driver, or property, or any combination thereof;

(n) "salvage vehicle" means any vehicle as defined in Subsection 41-1a-1001(8);

(o) "station" means a business or government facility located in Utah that is managed or operated by a valid permit holder and conducts safety inspections; and

(p) "vintage vehicle" means a motor vehicle or trailer as defined in Section 41-21-1.

**R714-160-21. Vintage Vehicles, Custom Vehicles, and Replica Vehicles.**

[~~\_\_\_\_\_ (1) A vintage vehicle does not require a safety inspection pursuant to Subsection 53-8-205(1)(b)(iii).~~]

(2) The following are minimum safety equipment requirements for a custom vehicle:

(a) hydraulic service brakes on all wheels with current vehicle brake and stopping standards;

(b) parking brake operating on at least two wheels on the same axle;

- (c) seat belts for all passengers and driver;
- (d) sealed beam or halogen headlamps;
- (e) brake Lamps;
- (f) turn signal lamps and switch;
- (g) AS-1 safety glass or Lexan; and
- (h) electric or vacuum windshield wiper in front of the

drivers view.

([3]2) The inspector shall issue a rejection inspection certificate when any of the above requirements are not met.

([4]3) Exhaust systems may discharge along the side of the vehicle provided they discharge at a point behind the rear edge of the door and exhaust is directed away from the vehicle.

([5]4) The vehicle identification for a custom vehicle shall be a number stamped on the frame of the vehicle.

(a) If no such numbers exist, then the requirements as established pursuant to Rule R873-22M-15 must be followed in order to pass inspection.

([6]5) All safety equipment of a replica vehicle shall comply with the requirements in Subsection 41-6a-1507(3).

#### **R714-160-23. Reconstructed/Salvaged Motor Vehicles.**

(1) Safety inspection for a salvaged vehicle is required as stated in Subsection 53-8-205~~(3)~~(1)(a).

(2) The inspector shall check all components and follow the requirements in this Rule.

(a) The inspector shall issue a rejection inspection certificate when any components and repairs are not made or installed in accordance with applicable provisions for the particular chassis from the original manufacturer.

#### RULE ANALYSIS

PURPOSE OF THE RULE OR REASON FOR THE CHANGE: The Utah Department of Transportation (UDOT) seeks to update Rule R930-8. This rule contains formal procedures for highway improvement projects that involve the adjustment or relocation of utility facilities by providing for the exchange of information, and the implementation respective responsibilities among the Department, utility owners, and

their respective contractors. The principal objectives of this update is to achieve the following beneficial outcomes: 1) provide proper definition reference; 2) ensure staff has authority to fulfill obligations of this rule; and 3) make technical and semantic changes to text.

**SUMMARY OF THE RULE OR CHANGE:** In Subsection R930-8-3(3), the definition reference from Subsection 54-3-29(1)(f) is changed, which was recently argued by an attorney that the utility was not regulated by the PSC so the definition did not apply to the definition of a utility in Section 72-6-116. UDOT has been functioning with this definition to date. In Subsection R930-8-10(1), the authority reference from the Statewide Utilities and Railroad Engineer as the authority to issue an Administrative Order to the Statewide Railroad and Utilities Director is changed. The title of Engineer no longer exists and without this change, the Director may not legally have the authority to issue an Administrative Order. This rule is consistent with other required Rules, federal standards, and Department general policies.

**STATUTORY OR CONSTITUTIONAL AUTHORIZATION FOR THIS RULE:** Subsection 54-3-29(5)(b) and Subsection 54-3-29(6) and Subsection 54-3-29(7) and Subsection 72-6-116(2) and Subsection 72-6-116(6)

#### **ANTICIPATED COST OR SAVINGS TO:**

◆ **THE STATE BUDGET:** UDOT does not anticipate that these proposed rule changes will affect the state budget in any way because their purpose is to correct an erroneous statutory citation, recognize a title change for a UDOT employee, and make technical and semantic changes to the text, none of which will lead to fiscal changes.

This fiscal impact may be positive or negative, depending upon the specific facility impacted and how the Department defines fiscal impact.
  - a) The utilities industry is comprised of establishments involved in:
    - i) Electric power generation, transmission, and distribution, NAICS of 221112 for generation, and 221122 for distribution;
    - ii) Natural gas distribution, NAICS of 221210; and
    - iii) Water distribution and irrigation systems, NAICS 221310, Sewer systems, NAICS 221320.
  - b) The telecommunications industry is comprised of establishments involved in:
    - i) Wired Telecommunications Carriers NAICS of 517311; and
    - ii) Wireless Telecommunications Carriers (except Satellite), NAICS of 517312.
- 2) The Department of Workforce Services (DWS) Firm Find Data includes information about firms within the seven industries identified by the NAICS industry code, which data on numbers of employees by firm follows:
  - a) Electric power generation, transmission, and distribution, NAICS of 221112 for generation, lists 16 firms total, 11 are small businesses; and 221122 for distribution; lists 57 firms total, 52 are small businesses;
  - b) Natural gas distribution, NAICS of 221210, lists 46 firms total, 40 are small businesses;
  - c) Water distribution and irrigation systems, NAICS 221310, lists 182 firms total, 177 are small businesses;
  - d) Sewer systems, NAICS 221320, lists 48 firms total, 46 are small businesses;
  - e) Wired Telecommunications Carriers NAICS of 517311, lists 150 firms total, 135 are small businesses; and

f) Wireless Telecommunications Carriers (except Satellite), NAICS of 517312, lists 56 firms, 55 are small businesses.

3) Of these 555 firms in the seven possibly affected industries, 39 are non-small businesses and 516 are small businesses, as defined by Utah Code Section 63G-3-102(19). For a complete list of these firms, contact the Department.

4) The Department's research suggests there will be zero compliance costs associated with these proposed amendments for the average impacted utility.

5) The Department does not believe this proposed amendment will lead to any compliance costs for possibly affected utilities because, while these proposed amendments are substantive, they only change the way "utility" and "utility company" are defined, the title of the Department engineer responsible for regulating utilities and makes technical and semantic changes. None of these changes will lead to additional costs or saving to the possibly affected firms.

### **R930. Transportation, Preconstruction.**

#### **R930-8. Utility Relocations Required by Highway Projects.**

##### **R930-8-1. Purpose.**

This Rule sets forth the Department's requirements and authority as to a Utility Company's coordination and cooperation when removal, relocation, or alteration of a Utility Facility is made necessary by a highway project and sets forth the options the Department may pursue to proceed with a highway project in the event that a Utility Company fails to cooperate or coordinate with the Department as required by statute or rule.

##### **R930-8-2. Authority.**

This Rule is enacted pursuant to Utah Code Sections 54-3-29(5)(b), (6), and (7), and 72-6-116(2) and (6).

##### **R930-8-3. Definitions.**

As used in this Rule R930-8:

(1) "Department" means the Utah Department of Transportation.

(2) "Non-operating Property" and "Non-operating Real Property" refer to property owned by a Utility Company that is not directly part of the Utility Company's physical plant or facilities that provide the utility service.

(3) "Utility Company" and "Utility" shall have the same definition as in Utah Code Section ~~54-3-29(1)(f)~~ 72-6-116(b) and (c) and may be used interchangeably.

(4) "Utility Facility" shall have the same definition as in Utah Code Section 54-3-29(1)(g).

##### **R930-8-4. Utility Company Coordination and Cooperation.**

When the Department notifies a Utility that relocation of a Utility Facility may be necessary due to a highway project, both the Department and the Utility shall use their best efforts to identify conflicts, minimize utility relocation costs and operational impacts, highway project costs and delays, and to coordinate and cooperate with one another, as directed in Utah Code Sections 54-3-29(6)-(7) and 72-6-116(6). When the Department believes a conflict exists, it will offer an initial scoping meeting and provide authorization for the Utility to do preliminary design work. The Utility shall:

(1) Provide to the Department, the location of each Utility Facility likely to be affected following the process set forth in Rule R930-7-11(6).

(2) Identify to the Department conflicts between the Department's proposed highway work and the Utility's operation of its Utility Facilities.

(3) Submit to the Department all conveyances, vesting documents, or other evidence of title to real property related to the potential relocation of Utility Facilities as early as practicable.

(4) Submit to the Department the Utility's proposed design for relocation; detailed cost estimates; a reasonable relocation schedule to accommodate the highway project; reasonable limits on highway project work, including utility outage windows and construction loadings by the Department; and communication procedures between the parties. A reasonable relocation schedule for the project includes, but is not limited to, work sequencing, task durations, material ordering, notification requirements, mobilization, third-party coordination, communication between the parties, and any other activity necessary for the relocation of the Utility Facility to accommodate the highway project. If the relocation work is to be completed prior to the Department awarding the highway project to its contractor, the Utility shall include specific dates in the schedule.

(5) Execute a written relocation agreement with the Department. The agreement shall include terms and conditions, including but not limited to, the relocation scope of work, reimbursement provisions, federal requirements, description and location of the work to be undertaken, plans and drawings, and detailed cost estimates.

(6) After the Department has awarded the highway project to the contractor, coordinate with the contractor to develop a detailed work plan and schedule and address all other matters of mutual concern during construction. Submit to the Department written acknowledgement of the approved schedule.

(7) Perform the work necessary for removal, relocation, or alteration of the Utility Facility in accordance with the detailed work plan and schedule developed in (4) and (6) above, and as described in the relocation agreement and supplemental agreements.

##### **R930-8-5. Timeliness.**

The work listed in Subsections R930-8-4(1) through (7) must be timely completed by the Utility as not to delay the highway project or otherwise increase costs to the project. The Department will provide reasonable deadlines for the Utility, so the Utility can meet the deadlines and not unnecessarily delay the highway project. The Department will also provide the Utility with reasonable updates of highway project schedule changes.

##### **R930-8-6. Relocation.**

The basic concept when relocating Utility Facilities is to functionally restore the Utility's operation facilities that existed prior to the Department constructing a highway project.

(1) The Department incorporates by reference 23 CFR Section 645, subpart A (05/15/1985), for all Utility Facility relocations required by the Department's highway projects. For deviations in determining whether the Utility's real property needed for the highway project should be handled as a utility relocation or right-of-way acquisition, Rule R930-7-13(5) shall apply.

(2) If the Utility's regulatory and construction requirements can be met, the Department may require Utility Companies to jointly occupy trenches for the highway construction projects. To the extent Utilities have valid agreements concerning the joint use of above ground facilities, the Utilities shall cooperate with each other for the relocated joint use.

(3) If a Utility determines the existing Utility Facilities do not need to be replaced or are not needed to maintain its operational facilities, payment for the real property, which is needed to accommodate the construction of the highway project where the Utility Facilities are located, shall be handled as a right-of-way acquisition.

#### **R930-8-7. Replacement of Property Rights.**

(1) When the Department replaces a Utility's fee interest or easement, the Utility shall transfer title to the prior fee or easement to the Department without charge.

(2) If the Utility has facilities within a fee or easement and the facilities are relocated within the Department's right-of-way, the Utility shall transfer title to the fee or easement without charge to the Department and the Department shall reimburse the Utility 100% of the future utility relocation costs in compliance with 23 CFR Section 645, subpart A.

(3) When the Utility's Utility Facilities are located in a public utility easement as defined in Utah Code Section 54-3-27, the Department may purchase a replacement public utility easement and may require the Utility to relocate its facilities to the replacement public utility easement.

(4) The Utility shall pay UDOT for any betterment between the existing real property interest and the real property interest acquired for relocation.

(5) If the Department obtains a court ordered occupancy or right-of-entry from a property owner, the Utility shall relocate its facilities onto the replacement property rights while the Department obtains the final order or deeds from the property owner.

(6) Acquisition of Non-~~o~~perating Real Property from a Utility shall be in accordance with the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970 and applicable right-of-way procedures in 23 CFR Section 710.203.

#### **R930-8-8. Reimbursement of Relocation Costs.**

(1) Reimbursement costs shall be determined in accordance with 23 CFR Section 645, subpart A, and the Program Guide, Utility Relocation and Accommodation on Federal-Aid Highway Projects, Sixth Edition, January 2003, as amended, Cost Development and Reimbursement, pages B-21 to B-23.

(2) If a Utility cannot provide a copy of a permit that shows the Department's acceptance of the deviation from the rule in effect at the time of installation of the Utility Facilities and the Utility Facilities do not meet the overhead clearance requirements, the Utility must relocate its facilities without any reimbursement from the Department. The Utility shall be responsible for 100% of its relocation costs for non-compliant utility facilities.

(3) When reimbursement is made on the basis of actual costs, the Utility's estimate and final billing shall be itemized to show the totals for labor, overhead construction costs, travel expenses, transportation, equipment, materials and supplies, handling costs, and other services.

(4) The Utility's final billing statement shall be provided in a format that facilitates making comparisons with the Department's approved estimates.

(5) A Utility must submit final billings to the Department within six months following the completion of the Utility Facility relocation work. The Department may make a final payment when the final bill is received from a Utility more than six months after the completion of the Utility Facility relocation work if the Department and the Utility have agreed in advance that a longer time period is needed.

(6) The costs incurred by the Department and a Utility for compliance with federal and state statutes, rules, and regulations will be included as part of the utility relocation costs.

(7) Temporary Utility Facility relocations required by the highway project will be included as part of the utility relocation costs.

(8) Telecommunication utility companies granted longitudinal interstate access are required to pay all relocation costs pursuant to Utah Code Section 72-7-108.

#### **R930-8-9. Betterments.**

No betterment credit is required for the replacement of utility devices or materials that are:

- (1) Required by the highway project;
- (2) Of equivalent standards although not identical;
- (3) Of the next highest grade or size when the existing devices or materials are no longer regularly manufactured;
- (4) Required by law pursuant to governmental and appropriate regulatory commission code; or

(5) Required by current design practices regularly followed by the Utility in its own work, and there is a resulting direct benefit to the highway project.

#### **R930-8-10. Issuance of Administrative Order; Enforcement.**

(1) In the event that a Utility fails to timely coordinate and cooperate with the Department at any point in the utility relocation process, the Department may issue an administrative order pursuant to Utah Code Section 72-6-116(2)(b) to the Utility to accommodate the highway project. The administrative order shall be issued by the Department's Statewide Railroad and Utilities ~~[and Railroads Engineer]~~ Director and will include a reasonable timeframe for Utility Company actions to be complete the relocation of the Utility Facilities, including any design.

(2) If the Utility fails to comply with the Department's administrative order, and the failure to comply is not caused by a third party who the Utility has no control over, the Department may issue an administrative order to remedy non-compliance. The Department may order any or all ~~of~~ the following remedies:

(a) The Department may recover from the Utility increased costs caused by the Utility's unreasonable or unjustified delays. Such actual and indirect costs may include, but are not limited to, increased costs on the current highway project or related projects, added expenses from loss of a construction season, and loss of project funding.

(b) The Department may deny further permits for utility installation under R930-7 until the Utility's non-compliance is resolved.

(c) The Department may perform design work and construction work on behalf of the Utility for those Utility Facilities located within the highway right-of-way, except for fiber for telecommunications, electricity, and natural gas. The Department will only perform such work if the work can be performed without violating any state or federal statute, regulation, or safety requirement. The Utility shall reimburse the Department for the costs the Department incurs to relocate the Utility's facilities, in amounts allowed by Utah Code Section 72-6-116(3).

(3) In addition, the Department may pursue additional remedies or claims against a Utility in a district court in Utah.

(4) The Department shall not limit or waive any of its remedies or claims allowed in this rule or law.

(5) The Department may require a Utility to comply with a practicable shortened process or expedited schedule when an emergency exists that could affect public safety or the structural or functional integrity of the highway.

**R930-8-11. Agency review.**

A Utility aggrieved by an administrative order issued under Rule R930-8-10 and Utah Code Section 72-6-116(2)(b) may file a written request for agency review with the Department pursuant to the Administrative Procedures Act, Utah Code Title 63G, Chapter 4, and Rule R907-1. The presiding officer for the agency review will be the Department's Director of Operations, who will issue the Department's Final Order. The administrative proceedings shall be informal.

This statute also explains that parents are responsible for the support of their child while the child is in the care of the state hospital. Sections 78A-6-1106 and 78B-12-106 authorize ORS to establish and enforce child support obligations for parents who are currently receiving adoption assistance or for children who are in the custody of the state. Sections 78B-12-201, 78B-12-203 through 216, 78B-12-219, 78B-12-301, and 78B-12-302 all provide the child support guidelines and tables used to calculate and adjust child support obligations.
