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EDITOR'S NOTES

LEGISLATION WHICH AFFECTS THE RULEMAKING PROCESS

The 2000 General Session of the 53rd Legislature ended on March 1, 2000. During the session, the Legislature passed one bill dealing with administrative rules in general.

S.B. 85 Reauthorization of Administrative Rules (Stephenson)

This is the Administrative Rules Review Committee's annual bill which is required by Section 63-46a-11.5. The long title describes S.B. 85 as "[a]n act . . . reauthorizing rules of state agencies . . ." This bill reauthorizes all administrative rules and provides for an effective date of May 1, 2000. The bill passed the Legislature on February 28, 2000, and was signed by the Governor on March 13, 2000.

REAUTHORIZATION OF ADMINISTRATIVE RULES

2000 GENERAL SESSION
STATE OF UTAH

Sponsor: Howard A. Stephenson

AN ACT RELATING TO STATE AFFAIRS IN GENERAL; REAUTHORIZING RULES OF STATE AGENCIES; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

This act enacts uncodified material.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

Section 1. **Rules authorized.**

All rules of Utah State agencies are reauthorized.

Section 2. **Effective date.**

This act takes effect on May 1, 2000.

SPECIAL NOTICES

EXECUTIVE ORDER

WHEREAS, in anticipation that in the year 2000, the State of Utah will again experience similar significant damage to crops such as small grains, alfalfa, and safflower in several regions infested with grasshoppers and/or Mormon crickets as in 1999; and

WHEREAS, surveys in 1999 showed a conservative estimate of more than 1.5 million acres of public and private land to be significantly infested with grasshoppers and/or Mormon crickets in 18 Utah counties; and

WHEREAS, the eggs laid last year by grasshoppers and/or Mormon crickets on these public and private lands will soon hatch, continuing a reproductive cycle that will exponentially increase this year's insect population over 1999 infestation levels, with corresponding serious consequences for farmers and residents in the affected communities; and

WHEREAS, the Utah Commissioner of Agriculture and Food has again declared an insect emergency in several Utah counties making state funds available for grasshopper and Mormon cricket treatment following the recommendation of the 1999 Grasshopper and Mormon cricket Decision and Action Committee authorized under the Insect Infestation Emergency Control Act;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Michael O. Leavitt, Governor of the State of Utah, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of the State of Utah, including Section 59-1-903 of the Utah Code,

DO HEREBY DECLARE THAT: It is found, determined, and declared that a "State of Agricultural Emergency" will exist due to the aforesaid grasshopper and Mormon cricket infestation in the State of Utah and that all such affected areas within the State are declared to be agricultural disasters requiring aid, assistance and relief pursuant to the provision of State statutes.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have here unto set my hand and cause to be affixed the Great Seal of the State of Utah. Done at the State Capitol in Salt Lake City, Utah, this 15th day of March, 2000.

EXECUTIVE ORDER

WHEREAS, the Legislature passed House Bill 320, Public Utility Amendments, in the 2000 General Session;

WHEREAS, I will allow the bill to become law without my signature on the condition and with the understanding that the Legislature is committed to engage in a thorough review of the law, which is not scheduled to take effect until July 1, 2001;

WHEREAS, by passing H.B. 320, the Legislature has made clear that it favors a change in regulatory structure and policy, and the Legislature has inserted a delayed effective date in the bill to permit additional time to reevaluate and review the law;

WHEREAS, the Public Utilities and Technology Interim Committee will make study of the bill a principal focus of its interim meetings, will make a report by December 1, 2000, and will work toward developing a new bill for consideration in the 2001 General Session of the Legislature;

WHEREAS, the committee has agreed to my request that it address at least four key issues: (1) Will the voice of the public be fairly and independently represented in regulatory decision-making and in a manner that is adequately financed? (2) What are the appropriate factors to balance in determining "just and reasonable" compensation for a utility? (3) Does the new law adequately accommodate differences among the various industries subject to regulation? (4) Does the law create and preserve incentives for *all* interested parties to reach balanced agreement and compromise?; and

WHEREAS, it is the policy of this administration to support the Legislature in this study and to seek fair and efficient improvement to regulatory structure and policy;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Michael O. Leavitt, Governor of the State of Utah, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of the State of Utah, hereby order as follows:

1. The Division of Public Utilities and the Committee of Consumer Services shall participate in the study and assist and cooperate with the Legislature and legislative staff to enhance the quality of the study.
2. The division and the committee shall keep my office informed of the progress of the study.
3. This order shall remain in effect until December 31, 2000.

**PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PETITION FOR RULE CHANGE REGARDING THE
QUALIFICATIONS OF LOCAL HEALTH OFFICERS**

The Utah Department of Health, Executive Director's Office hereby requests comments on the petition for rule change to R380-40-6(D) and R380-40-6(E) filed by Dr. Frank Brown, Chair, Weber-Morgan Board of Health. The Petition is available the office of the Executive Director, Utah Department of Health at 288 North 1460 West in Salt Lake City.

SPECIAL NOTICES

This rule sets the minimum qualifications for a local health officer. The current rule states:

D. Local health officers shall have the qualifications of training and experience as required by the Utah Department of Health Approved Class Specifications:

1. District Director of Health 27, Class Code 4399, 3/7/81;
2. District Director of Health 29, Class Code 4400, 3/7/81;
3. District Director of Health 37, Class Code 4033, 3/1/72;
4. District Director of Health 38, Class Code 4034, 11/1/77.

E. Health districts having a population of 100,000 or greater shall hire a physician health officer. An exception would occur if a health district's population exceeds the 100,000 population threshold during the tenure of a non-physician health officer, in which case the district may retain the non-physician health officer.

The Petition proposes that the rule be changed as follows:

(D) Local Health Officers - Qualifications

(1) The Local Health Officers shall satisfy one of the four following criteria:

I. Be a physician who is a graduate of a regularly chartered and legally constituted medical school, licensed to practice medicine and surgery in all branches in the state and who shall have successfully completed a master's degree of public health from an accredited school of public health or from an accredited program of public health and have at least three years professional full-time experience in a senior level administrative capacity;

II. Be a physician who is a graduate of a regularly chartered and legally constituted medical school, licensed to practice medicine and surgery in all branches in the state and who shall have successfully completed at least one year's graduate work in an accredited school of public health and have at least five years professional full-time experience, of which at least three years have been in public health in a senior level administrative capacity;

III. Have successfully completed a master's degree of public health from an accredited school of public health or from an accredited program of public health and have at least five years of professional full-time experience, of which at least three years have been in public health in a senior level administrative capacity; or

IV. Have a bachelors degree in public health or a related field, and have at least seven years of professional full-time experience in public health programs, of which at least five years have been in a senior level administrative capacity; and

(2) be thoroughly informed and experienced in all aspects of public health work.

(E) Local Health Officers - Qualifications

If the Local Health Officer is not a physician, the Local Health Department shall contract with a physician who has experience and knowledge in public health necessary to carry out the duties and responsibilities of the Local Health Department.

A public hearing will be held on Tuesday, April 4, 2000, at 8:30 a.m. in Room 114 in the Department of Health Building, 288 North 1460 West, in Salt Lake City. The purpose of the public hearing is to supplement written and e-mail comments to allow the Department to appropriately rule on the Petition.

NOTICES OF PROPOSED RULES

A state agency may file a PROPOSED RULE when it determines the need for a new rule, a substantive change to an existing rule, or a repeal of an existing rule. Filings received between March 2, 2000, 12:00 a.m., and March 15, 2000, 11:59 p.m., are included in this, the April 1, 2000, issue of the *Utah State Bulletin*.

In this publication, each PROPOSED RULE is preceded by a RULE ANALYSIS. This analysis provides summary information about the PROPOSED RULE including the name of a contact person, anticipated cost impact of the rule, and legal cross-references.

Following the RULE ANALYSIS, the text of the PROPOSED RULE is usually printed. New rules or additions made to existing rules are underlined (e.g., example). Deletions made to existing rules are struck out with brackets surrounding them (e.g., [~~example~~]). Rules being repealed are completely struck out. A row of dots in the text (•••••) indicates that unaffected text was removed to conserve space. If a PROPOSED RULE is too long to print, the Division of Administrative Rules will include only the RULE ANALYSIS. A copy of rules that are too long to print is available from the filing agency or from the Division of Administrative Rules.

The law requires that an agency accept public comment on PROPOSED RULES published in this issue of the *Utah State Bulletin* until at least May 1, 2000. The agency may accept comment beyond this date and will list the last day the agency will accept comment in the RULE ANALYSIS. The agency may also hold public hearings. Additionally, citizens or organizations may request the agency to hold a hearing on a specific PROPOSED RULE. Section 63-46a-5 (1987) requires that a hearing request be received "in writing not more than 15 days after the publication date of the PROPOSED RULE."

From the end of the public comment period through July 30, 2000, the agency may notify the Division of Administrative Rules that it wants to make the PROPOSED RULE effective. The agency sets the effective date. The date may be no fewer than 31 days nor more than 120 days after the publication date of this issue of the *Utah State Bulletin*. Alternatively, the agency may file a CHANGE IN PROPOSED RULE in response to comments received. If the Division of Administrative Rules does not receive a NOTICE OF EFFECTIVE DATE or a CHANGE IN PROPOSED RULE, the PROPOSED RULE filing lapses and the agency must start the process over.

The public, interest groups, and governmental agencies are invited to review and comment on PROPOSED RULES. *Comment may be directed to the contact person identified on the RULE ANALYSIS for each rule.*

PROPOSED RULES are governed by *Utah Code* Section 63-46a-4 (1996); and *Utah Administrative Code* Rule R15-2, and Sections R15-4-3, R15-4-4, R15-4-5, R15-4-9, and R15-4-10.

RULE ANALYSIS

PURPOSE OF THE RULE OR REASON FOR THE CHANGE: The purpose for filing this change to the section is to delete the Utah Respiratory Care Law and Rules Examination as a condition for licensure for respiratory care practitioners. It has been determined that there is a critical shortage of respiratory care practitioners in the state. Various medical treatment facilities are experiencing serious delays in recruiting qualified applicants in a timely manner because of the turn-around time to register and take the examination. Although it is important that practitioners be familiar with Utah law and rules, it is more important that vacancies in critical health care positions be filled in a timely manner.

SUMMARY OF THE RULE OR CHANGE: In Subsection R156-57-302a(3), "the Utah Respiratory Care Law and Rules Examination" is being deleted.

STATE STATUTORY OR CONSTITUTIONAL AUTHORIZATION FOR THIS RULE: Section 58-57-1, and Subsections 58-1-106(1) and 58-1-202(1)

ANTICIPATED COST OR SAVINGS TO:

- THE STATE BUDGET: The division will only incur minimal costs to reprint the rules once they are made effective. Any costs will be absorbed in the current division budget.
LOCAL GOVERNMENTS: Proposed rules do not apply to local governments; therefore, no cost or savings.
OTHER PERSONS: There will be a savings to respiratory care practitioner applicants of \$50, which is the amount charged for the law and rules examination. There are approximately 30 individuals who take the examination each year. The law and rules examinations are administered by a private testing agency who charges for and receives revenue from the candidates taking the examination. The testing agency will experience a decline in revenue as a result of the decline in the number of persons taking the exam of approximately \$1,500 per year.

COMPLIANCE COSTS FOR AFFECTED PERSONS: No costs are associated with this proposed rule filing, only savings for respiratory care practitioner applicants and a decline in revenue for the private testing agency as identified above.

COMMENTS BY THE DEPARTMENT HEAD ON THE FISCAL IMPACT THE RULE MAY HAVE ON BUSINESSES: The purpose of this proposed amendment is to eliminate the requirement that the

applicant take and pass the Utah Respiratory Care Law and Rules Examination by eliminating the examination. The division has determined that the value of the examination is more than offset by the delays it creates in the licensing of otherwise qualified professionals in this critical need area where a shortage of practitioners exist, due to the time expended in the process of registration, taking, scoring, and receiving notification of results of the examination. There will be no fiscal impact on the state budget as no revenue from the examination accrues to the division. There will be no impact on local governments. The regulated professionals will benefit from the rule amendment through the savings of the \$50 examination fee. The impact upon the testing agency will be a loss of approximately \$1,500 per year (30 applicants x \$50 exam fee)--Douglas C. Borba

RULE ANALYSIS

PURPOSE OF THE RULE OR REASON FOR THE CHANGE: The division wants to add two antifungal medications that can be prescribed by naturopathic physicians.

SUMMARY OF THE RULE OR CHANGE: In Subsection R156-71-202(1), added two antifungal medications, "Nystatin" and "Fluconazole," to the formulary list that can be prescribed by naturopathic physicians.

STATE STATUTORY OR CONSTITUTIONAL AUTHORIZATION FOR THIS RULE: Section 58-71-101, and Subsections 58-1-106(1) and 58-1-202(1)

ANTICIPATED COST OR SAVINGS TO:

❖THE STATE BUDGET: The division will incur minimal costs to reprint the rules once they are made effective. Any costs will be absorbed in the division's current budget. The division may see a possible increase in compliance costs, but only if complaints regarding the prescribing practices of naturopathic physicians increase.

❖LOCAL GOVERNMENTS: Proposed rules do not apply to local governments; therefore, no cost or savings.

❖OTHER PERSONS: The proposed rule change would achieve a savings for the public and insurance carriers. Patients who presently see a naturopathic physician needing these antifungal medications prescribed cannot receive this prescription. The patient needs to schedule another visit with a prescribing practitioner for the necessary prescription. If the naturopathic physician can prescribe the medication needed, the result would be a reduction in duplication of services. The actual savings are unable to be determined due to varying charges for different prescribing practitioners.

COMPLIANCE COSTS FOR AFFECTED PERSONS: The division does not anticipate a cost for any affected persons; only a savings as identified under "Other Persons".

COMMENTS BY THE DEPARTMENT HEAD ON THE FISCAL IMPACT THE RULE MAY HAVE ON BUSINESSES: The purpose of this rule amendment is to add two medications which can be prescribed by licensed naturopathic physicians. The fiscal impact on the state budget will be minimal and consist of the cost of printing the rules with the possibility of an increase in compliance costs if the changes generate complaints from the prescription of these medications. There will be no affect on local governments and the impact upon the health insurance industry and the general public would be positive

as it would dispense with the necessity of referral to a prescribing practitioner for prescription of these medications--Douglas C. Borba

R156-71. Naturopathic Physician Practice Act Rules.

R156-71-202. Naturopathic Physician Formulary.

(1) In accordance with Subsections 58-71-102(8) and 58-71-202, the naturopathic physician formulary which consists of noncontrolled substance legend medications deemed appropriate for the scope of practice of naturopathic physicians, the prescription of which is approved by the Division in collaboration with the Naturopathic Formulary Advisory Peer Committee, consists of the following legend drugs, listed by category:

Adrenergic Stimulators, limited to: Albuterol, Epinephrine, and Metaproteranol;

Amino Acids;

Anesthetics (local);

Antiemetics;

Antifungals, limited to: Nystatin and Fluconazole;

Antigout;

Antihistamines;

Anti-inflammatories, except DMARDS;

Antimicrobials (oral), limited to: Pencillins, 1st and 2nd generation Cephalosporins, Tetracyclines, Macrolides, Azalides, Lincosamines, Metronidazole, Hydantoin, and Sulfas;

Antimicrobials (ophthamologic), limited to: Sulfas and Macrolides;

Antimicrobials (topical);

Antivirals, limited to Acyclovir;

Biologics, limited to: Skin Testing, CDC recommended Immunizations, Toxoids, and Immunoglobulin;

Contraceptives, except implants and injections;

Corticosteroids (oral or topical), except Ophthamologic Preparations;

Diabetic Agents, limited to: Insulin, and oral Hypoglycemics, except Thiazolidinediones;
 Diuretics, limited to: Thiazide or Loop;
 Electrolyte and Fluid Replacements;
 Enzymes, limited to: Digestive and Proteolytic;
 H2 Blockers;
 Hormones (oral or topical), limited to: Estrogen, Testosterone, Progestins, and Thyroid;
 Migraine Preparations, limited to: Ergotamines and Sumatriptin;
 Minerals: Macro and Micro;
 Osteoporosis agents, limited to: Calcitonin and Raloxifene;
 Proton-Pump Inhibitors;
 Urinary Antispasmodics;
 Vitamins;
 Other: Methergine and Pitocin, limited to use only after the uterus has been emptied;
 Silver Nitrate.

(2) New categories or classes of drugs will need to be approved as part of the formulary prior to prescribing/administering.

(3) The licensed naturopathic physician has the responsibility to be knowledgeable about the medication being prescribed or administered.

RULE ANALYSIS

PURPOSE OF THE RULE OR REASON FOR THE CHANGE: The Safe Drinking Water Act Amendments of 1996 require states to establish Source Water Assessment programs for all sources of drinking water. The state of Utah currently requires assessment and protection of groundwater sources of drinking water. The new rule will provide assessment and protection for surface sources of drinking water.

SUMMARY OF THE RULE OR CHANGE: The Division of Drinking Water will delineate protection zones and provide each public water system (PWS) with a geographic information system

(GIS)-based inventory of major potential sources of contamination (PCS). The PWS will provide an inventory of smaller PCS (those not identified within the state's GIS database), will assess the susceptibility of the drinking water source to each PCS within the watershed contributing to the drinking water intake, and will develop management plan(s) to reduce the likelihood of contamination events from existing or future PCS. The PWS will also develop an implementation schedule and contingency plan. Both the program and the rule were developed in consultation with a Citizens and Technical Advisory Committee.

 FEDERAL REQUIREMENT FOR THIS RULE: Safe Drinking Water Amendments of 1996, Pub. L. No. 104-182, Sections 1453 and 1428(b)

ANTICIPATED COST OR SAVINGS TO:
 ❖THE STATE BUDGET: Cost of \$60,000--estimate of the salary and benefits for one full-time employee to oversee and manage the program.
 ❖LOCAL GOVERNMENTS: The estimated cost to municipalities and districts operating public water systems (PWS) is approximately \$10,000 per drinking water source. The estimated aggregate cost is approximately \$510,000. The Department of Environmental Quality expects that there will be undetermined savings related to stable or lowered costs for treatment of drinking water due to pollution prevention, undetermined savings related to preventing contamination events, and undetermined savings related to prevention of health problems associated with contaminated water supplies. All PWS are encouraged to combine their efforts to pursue source protection for jointly-used surface water sources; the cost per PWS would be lower if that effort is shared.
 ❖OTHER PERSONS: Cost to owners and operators of other public water systems may be \$5,000 to \$7,000 per source (source areas are generally smaller and less complex). There will be undetermined savings related to preventing contamination events, undetermined savings related to prevention of health problems associated with contaminated water supplies and undetermined savings related to stable or lower costs for treatment of drinking water due to pollution prevention. All PWS are encouraged to combine their efforts to pursue source protection for surface water sources; the cost per PWS would be lower if that effort is shared.
COMPLIANCE COSTS FOR AFFECTED PERSONS: Cost of approximately \$5,000 to \$10,000 per surface water drinking water source.

COMMENTS BY THE DEPARTMENT HEAD ON THE FISCAL IMPACT THE RULE MAY HAVE ON BUSINESSES: The Department of Environmental Quality believes that the expenses outlined above represent an investment in protecting drinking water supplies and in stabilizing or lowering treatment costs in the future. The initial expense will be balanced by the long-term benefit from cleaner drinking water sources, and fewer, less severe pollution events. --Dianne R. Nielson

R309. Environmental Quality, Drinking Water.

R309-605. Source Protection: Drinking Water Source Protection for Surface Water Sources.

R309-605-1. Purpose.

Public Water Systems (PWSs) are responsible for protecting their sources of drinking water from contamination. R309-605 sets forth minimum requirements to establish a uniform, statewide program for implementation by PWSs to protect their surface water sources of drinking water. PWSs are encouraged to enact more stringent programs to protect their sources of drinking water if they decide they are necessary.

R309-605 applies to all surface sources of drinking water which are used by PWSs to supply their systems and to ground-water sources which are under the direct influence of surface water. However, compliance with this rule is voluntary for existing surface water sources of drinking water which are used by public (transient) non-community water systems.

R309-605-2. Authority.

Under authority of Subsection 19-4-104(1)(a)(iv), the Drinking Water Board adopts this rule which governs the protection of surface sources of drinking water.

R309-605-3. Definitions.

(1) The following terms are defined for the purposes of this rule:

(a) "Controls" means the codes, ordinances, rules, and regulations currently in effect to regulate a potential contamination source. "Controls" also means physical controls which may prevent contaminants from migrating off of a site and into surface or ground water, and negligible quantities of contaminants.

(b) "Division" means Division of Drinking Water.

(c) "DWSP Program" means the program to protect drinking water source protection zones and management areas from

contaminants that may have an adverse effect on the health of persons.

(d) "DWSP Zone" means the surface and subsurface area surrounding a surface source of drinking water supplying a PWS, over which or through which contaminants are reasonably likely to move toward and reach such source.

(e) "Designated person" means the person appointed by a PWS to ensure that the requirements of R309-605 are met.

(f) "Executive Secretary" means the individual authorized by the Drinking Water Board to conduct business on its behalf.

(g) "Existing surface water source of drinking water" means a public supply surface water source for which plans and specifications were submitted to DDW on or before the effective date of this rule.

(h) "Intake" means the intake itself and also the conveyance to the point immediately preceding treatment, or, if no treatment is provided, at the entry point to the distribution system. The intake is considered to be identical to the POD.

(i) "Land management strategies" means zoning and non-zoning controls which include, but are not limited to, the following: zoning and subdivision ordinances, site plan reviews, design and operating standards, source prohibitions, purchase of property and development rights, public education programs, ground-water monitoring, household hazardous waste collection programs, water conservation programs, memoranda of understanding, written contracts and agreements, and so forth.

(j) "Land use agreement" means a written agreement wherein the owner(s) agrees not to locate or allow the location of uncontrolled potential contamination sources or pollution sources within zone 1 of delineated surface water sources. This restriction must be binding on all heirs, successors, and assigns. Land use agreements must be recorded with the property description in the local county recorder's office.

Land use agreements for protection areas on publicly owned lands need not be recorded in the local county recorder office. However, a letter must be obtained from the Administrator of the land in question and meet the requirements described above.

(k) "New surface water source of drinking water" means a public supply surface water source of drinking water for which plans and specifications are submitted to the Division after the effective date of this rule.

(l) "Nonpoint source" means any conveyance not meeting the definition of point source.

(m) "POD" means point of diversion. The point of diversion is the same as the intake.

(n) "Point source" means any discernible, confined, and discrete conveyance, including but not limited to any pipe, ditch, channel, tunnel, conduit, well, discrete fissure, container, rolling stock, animal feeding operation with more than ten animal units, landfill, or vessel or other floating craft, from which pollutants are or may be discharged. This term does not include return flows from irrigated agriculture.

(o) "Pollution source" means point source discharges of contaminants to surface water or potential discharges of the liquid forms of "extremely hazardous substances" which are stored in containers in excess of "applicable threshold planning quantities" as specified in SARA Title III. Examples of possible pollution sources include, but are not limited to, the following: storage facilities that store the liquid forms of extremely hazardous

substances, septic tanks, drain fields, class V underground injection wells, landfills, open dumps, land filling of sludge and septage, manure piles, salt piles, pit privies, drain lines, and animal feeding operations with more than ten animal units. The following definitions are part of R309-605 and clarify the meaning of "pollution source:"

(i) "Animal feeding operation" means a lot or facility where the following conditions are met: animals have been or will be stabled or confined and fed or maintained for a total of 45 days or more in any 12 month period, and crops, vegetation forage growth, or post-harvest residues are not sustained in the normal growing season over any portion of the lot or facility. Two or more animal feeding operations under common ownership are considered to be a single feeding operation if they adjoin each other, if they use a common area, or if they use a common system for the disposal of wastes.

(ii) "Animal unit" means a unit of measurement for any animal feeding operation calculated by adding the following numbers; the number of slaughter and feeder cattle multiplied by 1.0, plus the number of mature dairy cattle multiplied by 1.4, plus the number of swine weighing over 55 pounds multiplied by 0.4, plus the number of sheep multiplied by 0.1, plus the number of horses multiplied by 2.0.

(iii) "Extremely hazardous substances" means those substances which are identified in the Sec. 302(EHS) column of the "TITLE III LIST OF LISTS - Consolidated List of Chemicals Subject to Reporting Under SARA Title III," (EPA 550-B-96-015). A copy of this document may be obtained from: NCEPI, PO Box 42419, Cincinnati, OH 45202. Online ordering is also available at: <http://www.epa.gov/ncepihom/orderpub.html>.

(p) "Potential contamination source" means any facility or site which employs an activity or procedure which may potentially contaminate ground-water or surface water. A pollution source is also a potential contamination source.

(q) "PWS" means public water system.

(r) "Surface water" means all water which is open to the atmosphere and subject to surface runoff (see also R309-204-5(1)).

(s) "Susceptibility" means the potential for a PWS (as determined at the point immediately preceding treatment, or, if no treatment is provided, at the entry point to the distribution system) to draw water contaminated above a demonstrated background water quality concentration through any combination of the following pathways: geologic strata and overlying soil, direct discharge, overland flow, upgradient water, cracks/fissures in or open areas of the surface water intake and/or the pipe/conveyance between the intake and the water distribution system.

(t) "Watershed" means the topographic boundary, up to the state's border, that is the perimeter of the catchment basin that provides water to the intake structure.

R309-605-4. Implementation.

(1) Existing Surface Water Sources - Each PWS shall submit a Drinking Water Source Protection (DWSP) Plan to the Division of Drinking Water (Division) in accordance with R309-605-7 for each of its existing surface water sources according to the following schedule.

(2) New surface water sources - Each PWS shall submit a Preliminary Evaluation Report (PER) in accordance with R309-605-9 for each of its new surface water sources to the Division.

(3) PWSs shall maintain all land use agreements which were established under previous rules to protect their surface water sources of drinking water from contamination. Additionally, PWSs shall maintain land ownership and land-use agreements established under previous rules with new owners which prohibit these new owners from locating pollution sources within protection zones.

R309-605-5. Exceptions.

(1) Exceptions to the requirements of R309-605 or parts thereof may be granted by the Executive Secretary to a PWS if, due to compelling factors (which may include economic factors), a PWS is unable to comply with these requirements, and the granting of an exception will not result in an unreasonable risk to health.

(2) The Executive Secretary may prescribe a schedule by which the PWS must come into compliance with the requirements of R309-605.

R309-605-6. Designated Person.

(1) A designated person shall be appointed and reported in writing to the Executive Secretary by each PWS within 180 days of the effective date of R309-605. The designated person's address and telephone number shall be included in the written correspondence. Additionally, the above information must be included in each DWSP Plan and PER that is submitted to the Division.

(2) Each PWS shall notify the Executive Secretary in writing within 30 days of any changes in the appointment of a designated person.

R309-605-7. Drinking Water Source Protection (DWSP) for Surface Sources.

(1) DWSP Plans

(a) Each PWS shall develop, submit, and implement a DWSP Plan for each of its surface water sources of drinking water.

(i) Recognizing that more than one PWS may jointly use a source from the same or nearby diversions, the Division encourages collaboration among such PWSs with joint use of a source in the development of a DWSP plan for that source. PWSs who jointly submit an acceptable DWSP plan per R309-605-7 for one surface water source above common point(s) of diversion, will be considered to have met the requirement of R309-605-7(1)(a). Such collaboration may be deemed to be an effective use of effort, funds and resources, and may lead to a more effective and comprehensive protection and prevention program. The deadline from R309-605-4(1) that would apply to such a collaboration would be associated

with the largest population served by the individual parties to the agreement, unless an extension is granted by the Division.

(b) Required Sections for DWSP Plans - DWSP Plans should be developed in accordance with the "Standard Report Format for Surface Sources". This document may be obtained from the Division. DWSP Plans must include the following eight sections:

(i) DWSP Delineation Report - A DWSP Delineation Report in accordance with R309-605-7(3) is the first section of a DWSP Plan.

(ii) Susceptibility Analysis and Determination - A susceptibility analysis and determination in accordance with R309-605-7(4) is the second section of a DWSP report.

(iii) Management Program to Control Each Preexisting Potential Contamination Source - a management program to control each preexisting potential contamination source in accordance with R309-605-7(5) is the third section of a DWSP Plan.

(iv) Management Program to Control or Prohibit Future Potential Contamination Sources - A plan for controlling or prohibiting future potential contamination sources is the fourth section of a DWSP Plan. This must be in accordance with R309-605-7(6), consistent with the general provisions of this rule, and implemented to an extent allowed under the PWS's authority and jurisdiction.

(v) Implementation Schedule - The implementation schedule is the fifth section of a DWSP Plan. Each PWS shall develop a step-by-step implementation schedule which lists each of its proposed land management strategies with an implementation date for each strategy.

(vi) Resource Evaluation - The resource evaluation is the sixth section of a DWSP Plan. Each PWS shall assess the financial and other resources which may be required for it to implement each of its DWSP Plans and determine how these resources may be acquired.

(vii) Recordkeeping - Recordkeeping is the seventh section of a DWSP Plan. Each PWS shall document changes in each of its DWSP Plans as they are updated to show significant changes in conditions in the protection zones and management areas. As a DWSP Plan is executed, the PWS shall document any land management strategies that are implemented. These documents may include any of the following: ordinances, codes, permits, memoranda of understanding, public education programs, and so forth.

(viii) Public Notification - A method for, schedule for and example of the means for notifying the public water system's customers and consumers regarding the drinking water source water assessment and the results of that assessment is the last section of a DWSP plan. This must be in accordance with R309-605-7(7).

(c) DWSP Plan Administration - DWSP Plans shall be submitted, corrected, retained, implemented, updated, and revised according to the following:

(i) Submitting DWSP Plans - Each PWS shall submit a DWSP Plan to the Division in accordance with the schedule in R309-605-4(2) for each of its surface water sources of drinking water (a joint development and submittal of a DWSP plan is acceptable for PWSs with the joint use of a source, per R309-605-7(1)(a)(i).)

(ii) Correcting Deficiencies - Each PWS shall correct any deficiencies in a disapproved DWSP Plan and resubmit it to the Division within 90 days of the disapproval date.

(iii) Retaining DWSP Plans - Each PWS shall retain on its premises a current copy of each of its DWSP Plans. DWSP Plans shall be made available to the public upon request.

(iv) Implementing DWSP Plans - Each PWS shall begin implementing each of its DWSP Plans in accordance with its schedule in R309-605-7(1)(b)(v), within 180 days after submittal if they are not disapproved by the Division.

(v) Updating and Resubmitting DWSP Plans - Each PWS shall review and update its DWSP Plans as often as necessary to ensure that they show current conditions in the DWSP zones and management areas, but at least annually after the original due date (see R309-605-4(1)). Updated plans also document the implementation of land management strategies in the recordkeeping section. Updated DWSP Plans will be resubmitted to the Division every six years from their original due date. This applies even though a PWS may have been granted an extension beyond the original due date.

(vi) Revising DWSP Plans - Each PWS shall submit a revised DWSP Plan to the Division within 180 days after the reconstruction or redevelopment of any surface water source of drinking water which causes changes in source construction, source development, hydrogeology, delineation, potential contamination sources, or proposed land management strategies.

(2) DWSP Plan Review.

(a) The Division shall review each DWSP Plan submitted by PWSs and "concur," "concur with recommendations," "conditionally concur" or "disapprove" the plan.

(b) The Division may "disapprove" DWSP Plans for any of the following reasons:

(i) A DWSP Plan that is missing the delineation report or any of the information and data required in it (refer to R309-605-7(3));

(ii) An inaccurate Susceptibility Analysis or a DWSP Plan that is missing this report or any of the information required in it (refer to R309-605-7(4));

(iii) An inaccurate Prioritized Inventory of Potential Contamination Sources or a DWSP Plan that is missing this report or any of the information required in it (refer to R309-605-7(4)(c));

(iv) An inaccurate assessment of current controls (refer to R309-605-7(4)(a)(iii)(B));

(v) A missing Management Program to Control Each Preexisting Potential Contamination Source which has been assessed as "not adequately controlled" by the PWS (refer to R309-605-7(5));

(vi) A missing Management Program to Control or Prohibit Future Potential Contamination Sources (refer to R309-605-7(6));

(vii) A missing Implementation Schedule, Resource Evaluation, Recordkeeping Section, or Contingency Plan (refer to R309-605-7(1)(b)(v-vii) and R309-605-9).

(viii) A missing Public Notification Section (refer to R309-605-7(7)).

(c) The Division may "concur with recommendations" when PWSs propose management programs to control preexisting potential contamination sources or management programs to control or prohibit future potential contamination sources for existing or new drinking water sources which appear inadequate or ineffective.

(d) The Division may "conditionally concur" with a DWSP Plan. The PWS must implement the conditions and report compliance the next time the DWSP Plan is due and submitted to the Division.

(3) Delineation of Protection Zones

(a) The delineation section of the DWSP plan for surface water sources may be obtained from the Division upon request. A delineation section provided by the Division would become the first section of the submittal from the PWS. The delineation section provided by the Division will consist of a map or maps showing the limits of the zones described in R309-605-7(3)(b)(i-iv), and will identify potential contamination sources on record in the state's Geographic Information System.

(b) Alternatively, the PWS may provide their own delineation report. Such a submittal must either describe the zones as defined in R309-605-7(3)(b)(i-iv), or must comply with the requirements and definitions of R309-605-7(3)(c). The delineation report must include a map or maps showing the extent of the zones.

(i) Zone 1:

(A) Streams, rivers and canals: zone 1 encompasses the area on both sides of the source, 1/2 mile on each side measured laterally from the high water mark of the source (bank full), and from 100 feet downstream of the POD to 15 miles upstream. If a natural stream or river is diverted into an uncovered canal or aqueduct for the purpose of delivering water to a system or a water treatment facility, that entire canal will be considered to be part of zone 1, and the 15 mile measurement upstream will apply to the stream or river contributing water to the system from the diversion.

(B) Reservoirs or lakes: zone 1 is considered to be the area 1/2 mile from the high water mark of the source. Any stream or river contributing to the lake/reservoir will be included in zone 1 for a distance of 15 miles upstream, and 1/2 mile laterally on both sides of the source. If a reservoir is diverted into an uncovered canal or aqueduct for the purpose of delivering water to a system or a water treatment facility, that entire canal will be considered to be part of zone 1, and the 15 mile measurement upstream will apply to the reservoir and tributaries contributing water to the system.

(ii) Zone 2: Zone 2 is defined as the area from the end of zone 1, and an additional 50 miles upstream (or to the limits of the watershed or to the state line, whichever comes first), and 1000 feet on each side measured from the high water mark of the source.

(iii) Zone 3: Zone 3 is defined as the area from the end of zone 2 to the limits of the watershed or to the state line, whichever comes first, and 500 feet on each side measured from the high water mark of the source.

(iv) Zone 4: Zone 4 is defined as the remainder of the area of the watershed contributing to the source that does not fall within the boundaries of zones 1 through 3.

(v) Special case delineations:

(A) Basin Transfer PODs: Where water supplies are received from basin transfers, the water from the extraneous basin will be treated as a separate source, and will be subject to its own DWSP plan, starting from zone 1 at the secondary POD.

(c) If the PWS is able to demonstrate that a different zone configuration is more protective than those defined in R309-605-7(3)(b), that different configuration may be used upon prior review and approval by the Division. An explanation of the method used to obtain and establish the dimensions of the zones must be provided. The delineation report must include a map or maps showing the extent of the zones. The entire watershed boundary contributing to a source must be included in the delineation.

(4) Susceptibility Analysis and Determination:(a) Susceptibility Analysis:

(i) Structural integrity of the intake: The PWS will evaluate the structural intake of the source to ensure compliance with the existing source development rule (R309-204-5) on a pass or fail basis. The pass-fail rating will be determined by whether the intake meets minimum rule requirements, and whether the physical condition of the intake is adequate to protect the intake from contamination events. The integrity evaluation includes any portion of the conveyance from the point of diversion to the distribution systems that is open to the atmosphere or is otherwise vulnerable to contamination, including distribution canals, etc.

(ii) Sensitivity of Natural Setting: The PWS will evaluate the sensitivity of the source based on physiographic and/or hydrogeologic factors. Factors influencing sensitivity may include any natural or man-made feature that increases or decreases the likelihood of contamination. Sensitivity does not address the question of whether contamination is present in the watershed or recharge area.

(iii) Assessment of management of potential contamination sources:

(A) Potential Contamination Source Inventory

(I) Each PWS shall list all potential contamination sources within each DWSP zone or management area. The name and address of each non-residential potential contamination source is required, as well as a list of the chemical, biological, and/or radiological hazards associated with each potential contamination source. Additional information should include the name and phone number of a contact person. Additionally, each PWS shall identify each potential contamination source as to its location in zone one, two, three, or four and plot it on the map required in R309-605-7(3)(a and b).

(II) List of Potential Contamination Sources - A List of Potential Contamination Sources is found in the "Source Protection User's Guide." This document may be obtained from the Division. This list may be used by PWSs as a guide to inventorying potential contamination sources within their DWSP zones and management areas.

(III) Refining, Expanding, Updating, and Verifying Potential Contamination Sources - Each PWS shall update its list of potential contamination sources to show current conditions within DWSP zones or management areas. This includes adding potential contamination sources which have moved into DWSP zones or management areas, deleting potential contamination sources which have moved out, improving available data about potential contamination sources, and all other appropriate refinements.

(B) Identification and Assessment of Controls: The PWS will identify and assess the hazards at each potential contamination source as "adequately controlled" or "not adequately controlled".

(I) If controls are not identified, the potential contamination source will be considered "not adequately controlled." Additionally, if the hazards at a potential contamination source cannot be identified, the potential contamination source must be assessed as "not adequately controlled."

(II) Types of controls: For each hazard, one of the following controls should be identified (if applicable): regulatory, best management/pollution prevention, or physical controls. Negligible quantities of contaminants are also considered a control. The assessment of controls will not be considered complete unless the controls are completely evaluated and discussed in the DWSP report, using the criteria described in this section.

Regulatory Controls - Identify the enforcement agency and verify that the hazard is being regulated by them; cite and/or quote applicable references in the regulation, rule or ordinance which pertain to controlling the hazard; explain how the regulatory controls affect the potential for surface water contamination; assess the hazard; and set a date to reassess the hazard. For assistance in identifying regulatory controls, refer to the "Source Protection User's Guide" Appendix D for a list of government agencies and the programs they administer to control potential contamination sources. This guide may be obtained from the Division.

Best Management/Pollution Prevention Practice Controls - List the specific best management/pollution prevention practices which have been implemented by potential contamination source management to control the hazard and indicate that they are willing to continue the use of these practices; explain how these practices affect the potential for surface water contamination; assess the hazard; and set a date to reassess the hazard.

Physical Controls - Describe the physical control(s) which have been constructed to control the hazard; explain how these controls affect the potential for contamination; assess the hazard; and set a date to reassess the hazard.

Negligible Quantity Control - Identify the quantity of the hazard that is being used, disposed, stored, manufactured, and/or transported; explain why this amount should be considered a negligible quantity; assess the hazard; and set a date to reassess the hazard.

(C) For the purpose of meeting the requirements of R309-605, the Division will consider a PWS's assessment that a potential contamination source which is covered by a permit or approval under one of the regulatory programs listed below sufficient to demonstrate that the source is adequately controlled unless otherwise determined by the Executive Secretary. For all other state regulatory programs, the PWS's assessment is subject to review by; as a result, a PWS's DWSP Plan may be disapproved if the Division does not concur with its assessment(s).

(I) The Utah Ground-Water Quality Protection program established by Section 19-5-104 and Rule R317-6;

(II) Closure plans or Part B permits under authority of the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) of 1984 regarding the monitoring and treatment of ground-water;

(III) The Utah Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (UPDES) established by Section 19-5-104 and Rule R317-8; at the discretion of the PWS, this may include Confined Animal Feeding Operations/Animal Feeding Operations (CAFO/AFO) assessed under the Utah DWQ CAFO/AFO Strategy.

(IV) The Underground Storage Tank Program established by Section 19-6-403 and Rules R311-200 through R311-208; and

(V) the Underground Injection Control (UIC) Program for classes I-IV established by Sections 19-5-104 and 40-6-5 and Rules R317-7 and R649-5.

(b) Susceptibility determination:

(i) The PWS will assess the drinking water source for its susceptibility relative to each potential contamination source. The determination will be based on the following four factors: 1) the structural integrity of the intake, 2) the sensitivity of the natural setting, 3) whether a PCS is considered controlled or not, and 4) how the first three factors are interrelated. The PWS will provide an explanation of the method or judgement used to weigh the first three factors against each other to determine susceptibility.

(ii) Additionally, each drinking water source will be assessed for its overall susceptibility to potential contamination events. The determination will result in a qualitative assessment of the susceptibility of the drinking water source to contamination. This assessment of overall susceptibility allows the PWS and others to compare the susceptibility of one drinking water source to another.

(iii) Each surface water drinking water source in the state of Utah is initially considered to have a high susceptibility to contamination, due to the intrinsic unprotected nature of surface water sources. Each surface source will be considered to have a high susceptibility to contamination until a PWS or a group of PWSs demonstrates otherwise, per R309-605 and receives concurrence from the Division per R309-605-7(2).

(c) Prioritized Potential Contamination Source Inventory: The PWS will prepare a prioritized inventory of potential contamination sources based on the susceptibility determinations in R309-605-7(4)(b)(i). The inventory will rank potential contamination sources based on the degree of threat posed to the drinking water source as determined in R309-605-7(4)(b)(i).

(5) Management Program to Control Each Preexisting Potential Contamination Source.

(a) PWSs are not required to plan and implement land management strategies for potential contamination source hazards that are assessed as "adequately controlled."

(b) PWSs shall plan land management strategies to control each preexisting uncontrolled potential contamination source in accordance with their authority and jurisdiction. Land management strategies must be consistent with the provisions of R309-605, designed to control potential contamination, and may be regulatory or non-regulatory. Each potential contamination source listed on the inventory required in R309-605-7(4) and assessed as "not adequately controlled" must be addressed. Land management strategies must be implemented according to the schedule required in R309-605-7(1)(b)(v).

(c) PWSs with overlapping protection zones and management areas may cooperate in controlling a particular preexisting potential contamination source if one PWS will agree to take the lead in planning and implementing land management strategies. The remaining PWS(s) will assess the preexisting potential contamination source as "adequately controlled."

(6) Management Program to Control or Prohibit Future Potential Contamination Sources for Existing Drinking Water Sources.

(a) PWSs shall plan land management strategies to control or prohibit future potential contamination sources within each of its DWSP zones or management areas consistent with the provisions of R309-605 and to the extent allowed under its authority and jurisdiction. Land management strategies must be designed to control potential contamination and may be regulatory or non-regulatory. Additionally land management strategies must be implemented according to the schedule required in R309-605-7(1)(b)(v).

(b) Protection areas may extend into neighboring cities, towns, and counties. Since it may not be possible for some PWSs to enact regulatory land management strategies outside of their jurisdiction, except as described below, it is recommended that these PWSs contact their neighboring cities, towns, and counties to see if they are willing to implement protective ordinances to prevent surface water contamination under joint management agreements.

(c) Cities and towns have extraterritorial jurisdiction in accordance with Section 10-8-15 of the Utah Code Annotated to enact ordinances to protect a stream or "source" from which their water is taken . . . for 15 miles above the point from which it is taken and for a distance of 300 feet on each side of such stream. . .

(d) Zoning ordinances are an effective means to control potential contamination sources that may want to move into protection areas. They allow PWSs to prohibit facilities that would discharge contaminants directly to surface water. They also allow PWSs to review plans from potential contamination sources to ensure there will be adequate spill protection and waste disposal procedures, etc. If zoning ordinances are not used, PWSs must establish a plan to contact potential contamination sources individually as they move into protection areas, identify and assess their controls, and plan land management strategies if they are not adequately controlled.

(7) Public Notification:

Within their DWSP report, each PWS shall specify the method and schedule for notifying their customers and consumers that an assessment of their surface water source has been completed and what the results of that assessment are. Each PWS shall provide the proposed public notification material as an appendix to the DWSP report. The public notification material shall include a discussion of the general geologic and physical setting of the source, the sensitivity of the setting, general types of potential contamination sources in the area, how susceptible the drinking water source is to potential contamination and a map showing the location of the drinking water source and generalized areas of potential concern (it is not mandatory to show the location of the intake itself). The public notification material will be in plain English. The purpose of this public notification is to advise the public regarding how susceptible their drinking water source is to potential contamination sources. Examples of means of notifying the public, and examples of acceptable public notification materials, are available from the Division.

R309-605-8. DWSP for Ground-Water Sources Under the Direct Influence of Surface Water Sources.

(1) DWSP for ground-water sources under the direct influence of surface water sources will be accomplished through delineation of both the ground-water and surface water contribution areas. The requirements of R309-600 will apply to the ground-water portion, and the requirements of R309-605 will apply to the surface water portion, except that the schedule for such DWSP plans under this section will be based on the schedule shown in R309-605-4(1).

R309-605-9. New Surface Water Sources of Drinking Water.

(1) Prior to constructing a new surface water source of drinking water, each PWS shall develop a preliminary evaluation report (PER) which demonstrates that the source location has been chosen such that the number of uncontrolled sources in zones 1 and 2 is minimized. If the source water is not currently classified as 1C under UAC R317-2, the PWS must request such a classification from the Division of Water Quality for zones 1 and 2. The PWS should also consider requesting that the source water be categorized

as Category 1, 2 or 3 under UAC R317-2-3. Categorization of the source will reduce (Category 3) or eliminate (Category 1 and 2) the potential for source water degradation from new pollution sources. In addition, engineering information in accordance with R309-204-4 and R309-204-5 (general source development and surface water source development requirements) must be submitted to the Division concurrent with the PER. A complete DWSP plan is required, one year after approval of the PER and after construction of the source intake, following the requirements of R309-605-7.

(2) Preliminary Evaluation Report (PER) for New Sources of Drinking Water - PERs shall cover all four zones. PERs should be developed in accordance with the "Standard Report Format for New Surface Sources." This document may be obtained from the Division. PWSs shall include the following four sections in each PER:

(a) Delineation Report for Estimated DWSP Zones - The same requirements apply as in R309-605-7(3).

(b) Susceptibility Analysis and determination- The same requirements apply as in R309-605-7(4).

(c) Land Ownership Map - A land ownership map which includes all land within zones one and two and the primary use of the land (residential, commercial, industrial, recreational, crops, animal husbandry, etc). Additionally, include a list which identifies the land owners in zones one and two, the parcel(s) of land which they own, and the zone in which they own land. Small residential lots may be clustered as residential areas rather than identifying each residential parcel. A land ownership map and list are not required if ordinances are used to protect these areas. It is the responsibility of the PWS to cite, quote and document references and interpret the zoning ordinance to substantiate any land use restrictions.

(d) Documentation of Division of Water Quality classification of source water - with reference to R317-2, provide documentation of the classification of the source waters by the Division of Water Quality (see also R309-605-9(1)).

(3) DWSP Plan for New Sources of Drinking Water - The PWS shall submit a DWSP Plan in accordance with R309-605-4 for any new surface water source of drinking water within one year after the date of the Division's concurrence letter with the PER. In developing this DWSP Plan, PWSs shall refine the information in the PER by applying any new characteristics of the source.

R309-605-10. Contingency Plans.

PWSs shall submit a Contingency Plan which includes all sources of drinking water for their entire water system to the Division concurrently with the submission of their first DWSP Plan. Guidance for developing Contingency Plans may be found in the "Source Protection User's Guide." This document may be obtained from Division.

RULE ANALYSIS

PURPOSE OF THE RULE OR REASON FOR THE CHANGE: The purpose of the rule change is to adopt the yearly Addenda for ASME Power Piping and the 1999 NBIC addendum to ANSI/NB-23.

SUMMARY OF THE RULE OR CHANGE: The proposed rule amendments incorporate by reference the 1999 NBIC (National Board Inspection Code) Addendum for ANSI/NB-23 (American National Standards Institute/National Board-23), issued December 31, 1999; and the 1999 addenda to ASME (American Society of Mechanical Engineers) B31.1-1998 Edition Power Piping.

STATE STATUTORY OR CONSTITUTIONAL AUTHORIZATION FOR THIS RULE: Section 34A-7-101

THIS RULE OR CHANGE INCORPORATES BY REFERENCE THE FOLLOWING MATERIAL: 1) Power Piping ASME B31.1 (1998), ASME B31.1a -1999 Addenda (issued November 30, 1999); 2) National Board Inspection Code ANSI/NB-23 (1998), 1999 NBIC Addendum (issued December 31, 1999)

ANTICIPATED COST OR SAVINGS TO:

❖THE STATE BUDGET: There will be no cost or savings to the state budget. The Safety Division has previously purchased these codes, which includes the cost of the annual addenda. The substantive provisions of the 1999 addenda do not require any additional expense for administration or enforcement.

❖LOCAL GOVERNMENTS: As to the impact of the 1999 addenda on the cost to own or operate boilers or pressure vessels, such impact should be minimal. The 1999 addenda contains corrections to grammar and additions of new materials. These changes should result in no cost increase or savings to local government.

❖OTHER PERSONS: As to the impact of the 1999 addenda on other persons, such impact should be minimal. The 1999 addenda contains corrections to grammar and additions of new materials. These changes should result in no cost increase or savings to other persons.

COMPLIANCE COSTS FOR AFFECTED PERSONS: These 1999 addenda will not increase compliance costs for affected persons, i.e., manufactures or owner/operators of boilers and pressure vessels. The additional compliance requirements imposed by the 1999 addenda are already followed by most affected persons as part of existing practices.

COMMENTS BY THE DEPARTMENT HEAD ON THE FISCAL IMPACT THE RULE MAY HAVE ON BUSINESSES: The primary purpose of the 1999 addenda is to refine and clarify existing standards. Any changes imposed by the 1999 addenda have, for the most part, already been incorporated in the practices of the boiler and pressure vessel industry. Consequently, the commission does not expect the addenda to impose any fiscal burden on business.

RULE ANALYSIS

PURPOSE OF THE RULE OR REASON FOR THE CHANGE: In 1999, the Utah Legislature, through H.B. 273, shifted the responsibility for the licensing and regulation of private employment agencies to the Utah Labor Commission. As the Department of Workforce Services no longer has the statutory authority to perform this function, this rule is no longer necessary.

(DAR Note: H.B. 273 is found at 1999 Utah Laws 132, and was effective May 3, 1999.)

SUMMARY OF THE RULE OR CHANGE: This rule is repealed in its entirety.

STATE STATUTORY OR CONSTITUTIONAL AUTHORIZATION FOR THIS RULE: Sections 34-23-101, et seq., 34-29-1, et seq., 34-40-101, et seq., and 63-46b-1, et seq.; and Subsections 35A-1-104(1) and 35A-4-502(1)(b)

ANTICIPATED COST OR SAVINGS TO:

◆THE STATE BUDGET: Consistent with the change mandated by H.B. 273, the Utah Labor Commission promulgated Rule R610-4, effective July 1999, which addresses employment agency licensing. We are not familiar as to how the language in our existing rule may have been changed in the Labor Commission rule. Nevertheless, it would have been that entity's responsibility to identify any costs or savings as part of the rule filing process that was completed last year.

(DAR Note: R610-4 was a proposed new rule that is effective as of July 2, 1999. It was published in the June 1, 1999, issue of the *Utah State Bulletin* under DAR No. 22040.)

◆LOCAL GOVERNMENTS: See explanation given under "state budget."

◆OTHER PERSONS: See explanation given under "state budget."

COMPLIANCE COSTS FOR AFFECTED PERSONS: At present, the Department of Workforce Services lacks the statutory authority to enforce the existing rule. Any compliance costs associated with the function of licensing and regulating private employment agencies would need to be identified by the Utah Labor Commission, the entity that now has the authority to enforce such rules.

COMMENTS BY THE DEPARTMENT HEAD ON THE FISCAL IMPACT THE RULE MAY HAVE ON BUSINESSES: There should be no fiscal impact on business as it is our understanding that the administrative rules licensing and regulation of private employment agencies have not been eliminated, but instead shifted to another agency.

R994-700-104. Application for License:

— A written application for an employment agency license shall be filed with the Department and shall include:

— A. The name and address of the applicant. The names and addresses of each partner from applicant partnerships, and the name and address of principal officer or director, of applicant corporations.

— B. The full address of the place where the business of the employment agency is to be conducted.

— C. The business or occupation engaged in by each applicant, partner, principal officer or director for at least two years immediately preceding the filing of the application.

— D. The proposed name of the agency. The Department may reject any proposed name which is the same or similar to the Department of Workforce Services and its commonly used term of Department of Employment Development or to a presently licensed employment agency. The applicant which is to be an enfranchised member of an employment agency system may, however, include in its application the name of the system.

— E. In addition, two affidavits shall be submitted as to the character of applicants by persons who are residents of the city or county in which the agency is to be conducted, and who have known applicant for at least one year. Affidavit must be completed as to the individual or to the partners, if a partnership and if a corporation, as to the principal officer or director.

— F. A photo copy of the bond filed with the city or county as specified in Section 34-29-4.

— G. The applicant's completed financial statement.

— H. Other information as the Department may require.

R994-700-105. Eligibility Requirements for License:

— A. In the opinion of the Department applicant must be:

— 1. Of good character;

— 2. A person whose license has not been revoked for cause within three years from the date of application, and

— 3. Able to show financial responsibility for proper conduct of business.

— B. The applicant must be at least 21 years of age.

R994-700-106. Required Documents:

— The following documents must be filed for approval, together with the application for license.

— A. Fee schedules in duplicate as provided in Section 34-29-10:

— 1. Subsequent fee schedule changes may be made as provided in Section 34-29-10:

— B. Employer job order form in duplicate.

— C. Job applicant's contract if different from job order form.

R994-700-107. Application and Documents in Proper Form:

— If the application or the required documents are not in proper form when submitted, applicant may re-submit in proper form within 30 days after notice by the Department. If proper submission is not completed during this period, license will be denied.

R994-700-108. Period of License:

— A license to operate an employment agency is valid only for the person and place named in the license and is effective from the date specified therein to and including the next following December 31, unless suspended or revoked.

R994-700-109. Renewal of License:

— A. Annually, at least 45 days prior to the expiration date of the license, the Division shall mail to each currently licensed employment agency a license renewal application form and may require specific documents to be submitted with the renewal form.

— B. Each employment agency or their agent shall submit the completed license renewal form along with any requested documents at least 30 days prior to the expiration date of their current license.

R994-700-110. Advertising:

— A. No employment agency shall publish or cause to be published any false, fraudulent, or misleading information; representation, notice, or advertisement.

— B. Advertising shall be factual.

— C. Positions listed in the "Help Wanted" columns of newspapers or other media shall refer to bona fide openings available at the time copy is given to these publications for insertion.

R994-700-111. Ethical Practice and Conduct:

— Every licensee shall deal openly, fairly, and honestly in the conduct of the employment agency business and comply with the following standards:

— A. Relations with employers:

— 1. A candidate's personal record, employment record, qualifications, and salary requirements shall be stated by the agency to the employer as accurately and fully as possible.

— 2. Candidates shall be referred to the employer for interview only with the prior authorization of the employer through a bona fide job order, which may be given verbally.

— 3. Confidential information relating to the business policy of employers, which is imparted as an aid to the effective handling of their job requirements, shall be treated accordingly.

— 4. Letters, bulletins, and resumes concerning applicants that are presented to employers shall represent bona fide candidates.

B. Service charges and collections.

— 1. No fee charge shall exceed the maximum amount applicable, as listed on the fee schedule filed with the Department, at the time of job referral resulting from a bona fide job order.

— 2. No job applicant shall be held obligated for a fee until an offer and acceptance have been made between employer and job applicant as a result of the agency's efforts resulting from a bona fide job order.

— 3. Adjustments and refunds of fees shall be made promptly.

— 4. Account collection methods shall conform to ethical business standards.

R994-700-112. Bona Fide Job Order:

— A bona fide order for employment may be considered to have been given by an employer to an employment agency under the following conditions:

— A. If the employer or his agent, in person, by telephone, by telegram, or in writing, registered a request that the agency recruit, or gave permission to the agency to refer, applicants for employment who meet stated job specifications and furnishes information as required by Section 34-29-13:

— 1. The order is valid for the referral of any qualified applicant until it is filled or canceled by the employer and may serve as the basis for agency advertising. The agency shall contact the employer after a reasonable length of time to insure that the position is still vacant prior to any additional advertising.

— B. A bona fide order for employment valid for one specific applicant only (and not valid for advertising) shall be considered to have been given if, as the result of the agency's bringing the qualifications of the job applicant to the attention of an employer, the employer's interest in exploring the possibility of employing the applicant is evidenced by one or more of the following facts:

— 1. The employer agrees to interview the job applicant.

— 2. The employer requests that the agency furnish him with the job applicant's resume or other written history data.

— 3. The employer initiates direct contact with the job applicant as a result of information furnished by the agency.

— C. The employment agency shall identify itself to employers as an agency and in all cases where the employer is to pay the fee, the agency must obtain the employer's agreement from the personnel manager or other agent.

R994-700-113. Commencement of Agency Action and Hearings:

— A. A dispute involving fees, as denoted in Section 34-29-10(3), shall be filed with the Division in writing, which filing shall constitute a request for agency action.

— B. For purposes of Section 63-46b-4(1), the agency action requested in R994-700-113.A. is designated as an informal adjudicative proceeding conducted subject to the provisions of Section 63-46b-5. However, any proceeding may be converted to a formal adjudicative proceeding pursuant to Section 63-46b-4(3).

— C. The Division may investigate any complaint filed against an employment agency to determine the merits of the complaint, and attempt to resolve the dispute.

— D. If an informal hearing is held, the presiding officer shall hear both sides and accept all relevant evidence.

— 1. A signed Order by the presiding officer shall be issued pursuant to Section 63-46b-5.

— 2. After issuance of the presiding officer's Order, the only agency review from an informal adjudicative proceeding available to any party is a request for reconsideration as specified in Section 63-46b-13. Reconsideration shall be based on the contents of the file. The Department, or Division Director if so designated by the Department, shall be the reviewer for the purpose of reviewing all matters where a request for reconsideration was properly filed and shall do so pursuant to Section 63-46b-13(3).

— 3. Judicial review of the final agency action resulting from an informal adjudicative proceeding shall be by the district court pursuant to Section 63-46b-15.

— E. Any proceeding converted to a formal adjudicative proceeding by the presiding officer shall be conducted pursuant to Section 63-46b-8.

— 1. A signed Order issued by the presiding officer shall be pursuant to Section 63-46b-10.

— 2. After issuance of the presiding officer's Order resulting from a formal adjudicative proceeding, any party may seek review of the Order by the Department, pursuant to Section 63-46b-12.

— 3. Judicial review of the final agency action resulting from a formal adjudicative proceeding shall be pursuant to Section 63-46b-16.

R994-700-114. Time:

— A. An Order is deemed issued on the date on the face of the Order which is the date the presiding officer signs the Order.

— B. In computing any period of time prescribed or allowed by these rules or by applicable statute:

— 1. The day of the act, event, finding, or default, or the date an Order is issued, shall not be included;

— 2. The last day of the period so computed shall be included, unless it is a Saturday, a Sunday, or a state legal holiday, in which event the period runs until the end of the next working day;

This analysis provides summary information about the 120-DAY RULE including the name of a contact person, justification for filing a 120-DAY RULE, anticipated cost impact of the rule, and legal cross-references. A row of dots in the text (••••) indicates that unaffected text was removed to conserve space.

A 120-DAY RULE is effective at the moment the Division of Administrative Rules receives the filing, or on a later date designated by the agency. A 120-DAY RULE is effective for 120 days or until it is superseded by a permanent rule.

Because 120-DAY RULES are effective immediately, the law does not require a public comment period. However, when an agency files a 120-DAY RULE, it usually files a PROPOSED RULE at the same time, to make the requirements permanent. Comment may be made on the proposed rule. Emergency or 120-DAY RULES are governed by *Utah Code* Section 63-46a-7 (1996); and *Utah Administrative Code* Section R15-4-8.

RULE ANALYSIS

PURPOSE OF THE RULE OR REASON FOR THE CHANGE: The change is to comply with a Utah Department of Health (UDOH) policy change, and still stay within the guidelines of Sections 1902(r)(2) and 1931 of the Social Security Act.

SUMMARY OF THE RULE OR CHANGE: The earned income section of the rule will include a provision to exclude the earned income of temporary census workers for determining eligibility for certain medical assistance programs. The exclusion affects only those programs that use a percentage of the federal poverty guideline as an eligibility income limit and the Family Medicaid Program.

STATE STATUTORY OR CONSTITUTIONAL AUTHORIZATION FOR THIS RULE: Section 26-18-1
FEDERAL REQUIREMENT FOR THIS RULE: Sections 1902(r)(2) and 1931 of the Social Security Act

ANTICIPATED COST OR SAVINGS TO:

❖**THE STATE BUDGET:** There are no budget impacts by this rulemaking. The change will affect currently eligible recipients and simply allow them to retain medical assistance while doing temporary work for the Census Bureau. No costs are incurred by the department or others, as these individuals are already eligible.

❖**LOCAL GOVERNMENTS:** This rule does not apply to local government, so there would be no fiscal impact.

❖**OTHER PERSONS:** Some individuals receiving medical assistance are able to do temporary work for the Census Bureau without the threat of losing their eligibility.

COMPLIANCE COSTS FOR AFFECTED PERSONS: There would be no fiscal impact on affected persons other than that described in the explanation given under "Other Persons."

COMMENTS BY THE DEPARTMENT HEAD ON THE FISCAL IMPACT THE RULE MAY HAVE ON BUSINESSES: This rule will have a negligible impact on business--Rod L. Betit

EMERGENCY RULE REASON AND JUSTIFICATION: REGULAR RULEMAKING PROCEDURES WOULD place the agency in violation of federal or state law.

Under the president's welfare-to-work initiative, the Census Bureau aims to hire thousands of TANF (Temporary Assistance for Needy Families) beneficiaries and other low-income individuals. This change is needed to ensure that individuals (and their families) who are temporarily hired to assist in Census 2000 do not lose eligibility for Medicaid or the State Children's Health Insurance Program (SCHIP) because of the income they receive from employment by the Census Bureau.

R414. Health, Health Care Financing, Coverage and Reimbursement Policy.

R414-304. Income and Budgeting.

R414-304-1. Definitions.

The definitions in R414-1 and R414-301 apply to this rule. In addition:

(1) "Allocation for a spouse" means an amount of income that is the difference between the SSI federal benefit rate for a couple minus the federal benefit rate for an individual.

(2) "Basic maintenance standard (BMS)" means the income level for eligibility based on the number of family members who are counted in the medical assistance unit.

(3) "Benefit month" means a month in which an individual is eligible for Medicaid.

(4) "Poverty-related program" means a medical assistance program that uses a percentage of the federal poverty guideline for the household size involved to determine eligibility

R414-304-2. A, B and D Medicaid and A, B and D Institutional Medicaid Unearned Income Provisions.

(1) The Department adopts 42 CFR 435.725 through 435.845, 1998 ed., and 20 CFR 416.1102, 416.1103, 416.1120 through 416.1148, 416.1150, 416.1151, 416.1163 through 416.1166, and Appendix to Subpart K of 416, 1998 ed., which are incorporated by reference. The Department adopts Pub. L. No. 105-33(4735) which is incorporated by reference. The Department adopts Pub. L. No. 104-204(1805)(c) and (d) and 105-306(7)(a) and (c) which is incorporated by reference.

(2) The following definitions apply to this section:

(a) "Eligible spouse" means the member of a married couple who is either aged, blind, or disabled.

(b) "In-kind support donor" means an individual who provides food or shelter without receiving full market value compensation in return.

(c) "Presumed maximum value" means the allowed maximum amount an individual is charged for the receipt of food and shelter. This amount shall not exceed 1/3 of the SSI payment plus \$20.

(3) Only the portion of a VA check to which the client is legally entitled is countable income. VA payments for aid and attendance do not count as income. The portion of a VA payment which is made because of unusual medical expenses is not countable income. Other VA income based on need is countable income, but is not subject to the \$20 general income disregard.

(4) The value of special circumstance items is not countable income if the items are paid for by donors.

(5) For A, B and D Medicaid two-thirds of child support received a month is countable unearned income. It does not matter if the payments are voluntary or court-ordered. It does not matter if the child support is received in cash or in-kind.

(6) For A, B and D Institutional Medicaid court-ordered child support payments must be paid to the Office of Recovery Services (ORS) when the child resides out-of-home in a Medicaid 24-hour care facility. If the child has no income or insufficient income to provide for a personal needs allowance, ORS will allow the parent to retain up to the amount of the personal needs allowance to send to the child for personal needs. All other child support payments received by the child or guardian that are not subject to collection by ORS shall count as unearned to the child.

(7) The interest earned from a sales contract on either or both the lump sum and installment payments is countable unearned income when it is received or made available to the client.

(8) If the client, or the client and spouse do not live with an in-kind support donor, in-kind support and maintenance is the lesser of the value or the presumed maximum value of food or shelter received. If the client, or the client and spouse live with an in-kind support donor and do not pay a prorated share of household operating expenses, in-kind support and maintenance is the difference between the prorated share of household operating expenses and the amount the client, or the client and spouse actually pay, or the presumed maximum value, whichever is less.

(9) SSA reimbursements of Medicare premiums are not countable income.

(10) Reimbursements of a portion of Medicare premiums made by the state Medicaid agency to an individual eligible for QI-Group 2 coverage are not countable income.

(11) Payments under a contract, retroactive payments from SSI and SSA reimbursements of Medicare premiums are not considered lump sum payments.

(12) Educational loans, grants, and scholarships guaranteed by the U.S. Department of Education are not countable income if the recipient is an undergraduate. Income from service learning programs is not countable income if the recipient is an undergraduate. Deductions are allowed from countable educational income if receipt of the income depends on school attendance and if the client pays the expense. Allowable deductions include:

- (a) tuition;
- (b) fees;
- (c) books;
- (d) equipment;
- (e) special clothing needed for classes;

(f) travel to and from school at a rate of 21 cents a mile, unless the grant identifies a larger amount;

(g) child care necessary for school attendance.

(13) The following provisions apply to non-institutional medical assistance:

(a) For A, B, or D Medicaid, the income of a spouse is not considered in determining Medicaid eligibility of a person who receives SSI. SSI recipients who meet all other Medicaid eligibility factors are eligible for Medicaid without spending down.

(b) If an ineligible spouse of an aged, blind, or disabled person has more income after deductions than the allocation for a spouse, that income is deemed to be income to the aged, blind, or disabled spouse to determine eligibility.

(c) The Department shall determine household size and whose income counts for A or D Medicaid as described below.

(i) If only one spouse is aged or disabled:

(A) income of the ineligible spouse is deemed to be income to the eligible spouse when it exceeds the allocation for a spouse. The combined income is then compared to 100% of the federal poverty guideline for a two-person household. If the combined income exceeds that amount, it is compared, after allowable deductions, to the BMS for two to calculate the spenddown.

(B) If the ineligible spouse's income does not exceed the allocation for a spouse, only the eligible spouse's income is compared to 100% of the federal poverty guideline for one. If the income exceeds that amount, it is compared, after allowable deductions, to the BMS for one to calculate the spenddown.

(ii) If both spouses are either aged or disabled, the income of both spouses is combined and compared to 100% of the federal poverty guideline for a two-person household. SSI income is not counted.

(A) If the combined income exceeds that amount, and one spouse receives SSI, only the income of the non-SSI spouse, after allowable deductions, is compared to the BMS for a one-person household to calculate the spenddown.

(B) If neither spouse receives SSI and their combined income exceeds the federal poverty guideline, then the income of both spouses, after allowable deductions, is compared to the BMS for a two-person household to calculate the spenddown.

(d) The Department shall determine household size and whose income counts for B Medicaid as described below.

(i) If the spouse of a blind client is aged, blind, or disabled and does not receive SSI, income of both spouses is combined and, after allowable deductions, compared to the BMS for a two-person household to calculate the spenddown. If the spouse of a blind client receives SSI, then only the income of the blind spouse is compared to the BMS for one.

(ii) If the spouse is not aged, blind, or disabled, income is deemed to the blind spouse when it exceeds the allocation for a spouse, and, after allowable deductions, the combined income is compared to the BMS for two. If the ineligible spouse's income does not exceed the allocation for a spouse, only the blind spouse's income, after allowable deductions, is compared to the BMS for one person to calculate the spenddown.

(e) The Department shall determine household size and whose income counts for QMB, SLMB, and QI assistance as described below.

(i) If both spouses receive Part A Medicare, or one does and the other is aged, blind, or disabled, their income is combined and

compared to the applicable percentage of the federal poverty guideline for a household of two. SSI income is not counted.

(ii) If only one spouse receives Part A Medicare, and the other is not aged, blind, or disabled, income of the ineligible spouse is deemed to the eligible spouse when it exceeds the allocation for a spouse, and is compared to the applicable percentage of the federal poverty guideline for a household size of two. If the ineligible spouse's income does not exceed the allocation for a spouse, only the income of the eligible spouse is compared to the applicable percentage of the federal poverty guideline for a household size of one.

(f) If any parent in the home receives SSI, the income of neither parent is considered to determine a child's eligibility for B or D Medicaid.

(g) Payments for providing foster care to a child are countable income. The portion of the payment that represents a reimbursement for the expenses related to providing foster care is not countable income.

(14) For institutional Medicaid, The Department shall only count the client in the household size and only count the client's income to determine contribution to cost of care.

R414-304-3. Family Medicaid and Institutional Family Medicaid Unearned Income Provisions.

(1) The Department adopts 42 CFR 435.725 through 435.832, 1998 ed., and 45 CFR 233.20(a)(1), 233.20(a)(3)(iv), 233.20(a)(3)(v), 233.20(a)(3)(xxi), 233.20(4)(ii), and 233.51, 1998 ed., which are incorporated by reference. The Department adopts Pub. L. No. 105-33 (4735) which is incorporated by reference.

(2) The following definitions apply to this section:

(a) A "bona fide loan" is a loan that has been contracted in good faith without fraud or deceit and genuinely endorsed in writing for repayment.

(b) "Unearned income" means cash received for which the individual performs no service.

(c) "Quarter" means any three month period that includes January through March, April through June, July through September or October through December.

(3) Bona fide loans are not countable income.

(4) Support and maintenance assistance is not countable income.

(5) The value of food stamp assistance is not countable income.

(6) SSI and State Supplemental Payments are income for children receiving Child, Family, Newborn, or Newborn Plus Medicaid.

(7) \$30 is deducted from rental income if that income is consistent with community standards. Additional deductions are allowed if the client can prove greater expenses. The following expenses in excess of \$30 may be allowed:

(a) taxes and attorney fees needed to make the income available;

(b) upkeep and repair costs necessary to maintain the current value of the property. This includes utility costs.

(c) only the interest can be deducted on a loan or mortgage made for upkeep or repair;

(d) if meals are provided to a boarder, the value of a one-person food stamp allotment.

(8) Cash gifts that do not exceed \$30 a quarter per person in the assistance unit are not countable income. A cash gift may be divided equally among all members of the assistance unit.

(9) Deferred income is countable income when it is received by the client if receipt can be reasonably anticipated.

(10) The value of special circumstance items is not countable income if the items are paid for by donors.

(11) Home energy assistance is not countable income.

(12) All money received from an insurance settlement for destroyed exempt property is counted unless the income is used to purchase replacement property. If income received exceeds the money needed to replace the property, the difference is countable income.

(13) SSA reimbursements of Medicare premiums are not countable income.

(14) Payments from trust funds are countable income if the payments are not available on demand.

(15) FEP, Working Toward Employment Program payments, and Refugee Cash Assistance are not countable income.

(16) Only the portion of a Veteran's Administration check to which the client is legally entitled is countable income.

(17) When the entitlement amount of a check differs from the payment amount, the entitlement amount is countable income unless the deduction is involuntary.

(18) Deposits to joint checking or savings accounts are countable income, even if the deposits are made by a non-household member. Clients who dispute ownership of deposits to joint checking or savings accounts shall be given an opportunity to prove that the deposits do not represent income to them. Funds that are successfully disputed are not countable income.

(19) The income of an alien's sponsor is not countable income.

(20) The interest earned from a sales contract on either or both the lump sum and installment payments is countable unearned income when it is received or made available to the client.

R414-304-4. A, B and D Medicaid and A, B and D Institutional Medicaid Earned Income Provisions.

(1) The Department adopts 42 CFR 435.725 through 435.832, 1998 ed., and 20 CFR 416.1110 through 416.1112, 1998 ed., which are incorporated by reference. The department adopts Subsection 1612(b)(4)(A) and (B) of the Compilation of the Social Security Laws, in effect January 1, 1999, which is incorporated by reference.

(2) The Department shall allow SSI recipients, who have a plan for achieving self support approved by the Social Security Administration, to set aside income that allows them to purchase work-related equipment or meet self support goals. This income is excluded and may include earned and unearned income.

(3) Expenses relating to the fulfillment of a plan to achieve self-support are not allowed as deductions from income.

(4) For A, B and D Medicaid, earned income used to compute a needs-based grant is not countable.

(5) For A, B and D Institutional Medicaid, \$125 shall be deducted from earned income before contribution towards cost of care is determined.

(6) For A, B and D Institutional Medicaid impairment-related work expenses are allowed as an earned income deduction.

(7) Capital gains are included in the gross income from self-employment. The cost of doing business is deducted from the gross income to determine the countable net income from self-

employment. However, no deductions are allowed for the following business expenses:

- (a) transportation to and from work;
- (b) payments on the principal for business resources;
- (c) net losses from previous periods;
- (d) taxes;
- (e) money set aside for retirement;
- (f) work-related personal expenses;
- (g) depreciation.

(8) Net losses of self-employment from the current tax year may be deducted from other earned income.

(9) Earned income paid by the U.S. Census Bureau to temporary census takers is excluded for any A, B, or D category programs that use a percentage of the federal poverty guideline as an eligibility income limit.

R414-304-5. Family Medicaid and Family Institutional Medicaid Earned Income Provisions.

(1) The Department adopts 42 CFR 435.725 through 435.845, 1998 ed. and 45 CFR 233.20(a)(6)(iii) through (iv), 233.20(a)(6)(v)(B), 233.20(a)(6)(vi) through (vii), and 233.20(a)(11), 1998 ed., which are incorporated by reference.

(2) The following definitions apply to this section:

(a) "Full-time student" means a person enrolled for the number of hours defined by the particular institution as fulfilling full-time requirements.

(b) "Part-time student" means a person who is enrolled for at least one-half the number of hours or periods considered by the institution to be customary to complete the course of study within the minimum time period. If no schedule is set by the school, the course of study must be no less than an average of two class periods or two hours a day, whichever is less.

(c) "School attendance" means enrollment in a public or private elementary or secondary school, a university or college, vocational or technical school or the Job Corps, for the express purpose of gaining skills that will lead to gainful employment.

(d) "Full-time employment" means an average of 100 or more hours of work a month or an average of 23 hours a week.

(e) "Rateable reduction" means a 25% deduction of net income allowed in the AFDC program as in effect on June 16, 1996.

(f) "Aid to Families with Dependent Children" (AFDC) means a state plan for aid that was in effect on June 16, 1996.

(g) "Temporary Assistance to Needy Families" (TANF) means a grant program providing financial assistance to eligible families with dependent children. It is also referred to as Family Employment Program (FEP).

(3) The income of a dependent child is not countable income if the child is:

- (a) in school or training full-time;
- (b) in school or training part-time, if employed less than 100 hours a month;
- (c) in JTPA.

(4) For Family Medicaid the 30 and 1/3 deduction is allowed if the wage earner has received a TANF financial payment in one of the four previous months and this disregard has not been exhausted. The AFDC rateable reduction is not allowed for Medicaid.

(5) For Family Institutional Medicaid, the Department shall not allow the AFDC rateable reduction as a deduction.

(6) For Family Medicaid, the Department shall deduct child care costs from the earned income of clients working 100 hours or more in a calendar month. A maximum of up to \$200.00 per child under age 2 and \$175.00 per child age 2 and older may be deducted. A maximum of up to \$160.00 per child under age 2 and \$140.00 per child age 2 and older a month may be deducted from the earned income of clients working less than 100 hours in a calendar month.

(7) For Family Institutional Medicaid, the Department shall deduct child care costs from the earned income of clients working 100 hours or more in a calendar month. A maximum of up to \$160 a month per child may be deducted. A maximum of up to \$130 a month shall be deducted from the earned income of clients working less than 100 hours in a calendar month.

(8) Earned income paid by the U.S. Census Bureau to temporary census takers is excluded for any family Medicaid programs that use a percentage of the federal poverty guideline as an eligibility income limit, and for determining eligibility for 1931 Family Medicaid.

R414-304-6. A, B and D Medicaid and Family Medicaid Income Deductions.

(1) The Department adopts 42 CFR 435.831, 1998 ed., which is incorporated by reference.

(2) The Department allows health insurance premiums providing coverage for anyone in the family or the BMS as deductions in the month of payment. The entire payment is allowed as a deduction and is not prorated. The Department shall not allow health insurance premiums as a deduction for determining eligibility for the poverty-related medical assistance programs.

(3) Medicare premiums are not allowed as deductions if the state reimburses the client.

(4) Medical expenses are allowed as deductions only if the expenses meet all of the following conditions:

(a) The medical service was received by the client, client's spouse, parent of an unemancipated client or unemancipated sibling of an unemancipated client, a deceased spouse or a deceased dependent child.

(b) The medical bill shall not be paid by Medicaid or a third party.

(c) The medical bill remains unpaid or was paid during the month of application or at anytime in the three months immediately preceding the month of application. The date the medical service was provided on an unpaid expense does not matter.

(5) A medical expense is not allowed as a deduction more than once.

(6) A medical expense allowed as a deduction must be for a medically necessary service. The Department of Health is responsible for deciding if services are not medically necessary.

(7) The Department shall not allow co-payments owed or paid by the client to receive Medicaid-covered services as a medical expense.

(8) For poverty-related medical assistance, an individual or household is ineligible if countable income exceeds the applicable income limit. Medical costs are not allowable deductions for determining eligibility for poverty-related medical assistance programs. No spenddown is allowed to meet the income limit for poverty-related medical assistance programs.

(9) As a condition of eligibility, clients must certify on Form 1049B that medical expenses in the benefit month are expected to

exceed the spenddown amount. The client must do this when spenddown starts, at each review, and when the client chooses a different spenddown option. If medical expenses are less than or equal to the spenddown, the client is not eligible for that month. The client may elect to use allowable medical expenses the client still owes from previous months to reduce the spenddown so that expected medical expenses for the benefit month exceed the remaining spenddown owed.

(10) Pre-paid medical expenses are not allowed as deductions.

(11) The Department elects not to set limits on the amount of medical expenses that can be deducted.

(12) Clients may choose to meet their spenddown obligation by incurring medical expenses or by paying a corresponding amount to the Department.

(13) For A, B and D Medicaid institutional costs are allowed as deductions if the services are medically necessary. The Department of Health is responsible for deciding if services for institutional care are not medically necessary.

(14) No one is required to pay a spenddown of less than \$1.

(15) Medicaid covered medical costs incurred in a current benefit month cannot be used to meet spenddown when the client is enrolled in an HMO. Bills for mental health services incurred in a benefit month cannot be used to meet spenddown if the client will be eligible for Medicaid and lives in a county which has a single mental health provider under contract with Medicaid to provide services to all Medicaid clients who live in that county. Bills for mental health services received in a retroactive or application month that the client has fully-paid during that time can be used to meet spenddown as long as the services were not provided by the mental health provider in the client's county of residence which is under contract with Medicaid to provide services to all Medicaid clients.

R414-304-7. A, B, and D Institutional Medicaid and Family Institutional Medicaid Income Deductions.

(1) The Department adopts 42 CFR 435.725 and 435.726, 1998 ed., which are incorporated by reference. The Department adopts Subsection 1902(r)(1) and 1924 of the Compilation of the Social Security Laws, in effect January 1, 1999, which are incorporated by reference.

(2) The following definitions apply to this section:

(a) "Family member" means a son, daughter, parent, or sibling of the client or the client's spouse who lives with the spouse.

(b) "Dependent" means earning less than \$2,000 a year, not being claimed as a dependent by any other individual, and receiving more than half of one's annual support from the client or the client's spouse.

(3) Health insurance premiums:

(a) For institutionalized and waiver eligible clients, the Department shall allow health insurance premiums only for the institutionalized or waiver eligible client and only if paid with the institutionalized or waiver eligible client's funds. Health insurance premiums are allowed as a deduction in the month due. The payment shall not be pro-rated.

(b) The Department shall allow the portion of a combined premium, attributable to the institutionalized or waiver-eligible client, as a deduction if the combined premium includes a spouse or dependent family member and is paid from the funds of the institutionalized or waiver eligible client.

(4) Medicare premiums are not allowed as deductions if the state pays the premium or reimburses the client.

(5) Medical expenses are allowed as deductions only if the expenses meet all of the following conditions:

(a) the medical service was received by the client;

(b) the unpaid medical bill shall not be paid by Medicaid or a third party;

(c) the paid medical bill can be allowed only in the month paid. No portion of any paid bill can be allowed after the month of payment.

(6) A medical expense is not allowed as a deduction more than once.

(7) A medical expense allowed as a deduction must be for a medically necessary service. The Department of Health is responsible for deciding if services are not medically necessary.

(8) Pre-paid medical expenses are not allowed as deductions.

(9) The Department shall not allow co-payments a client owes or paid to receive Medicaid-covered services as a medical expense.

(10) The Department elects not to set limits on the amount of medical expenses that can be deducted.

(11) Institutionalized clients are to contribute all countable income remaining after allowable deductions to the institution as their contribution to the cost of their care.

(12) The personal needs allowance is \$45.

(13) An Individual receiving assistance under the terms of a Home and Community-Based Services Waiver is eligible to receive a deduction for a non-institutionalized, non-waiver-eligible spouse and dependent family member as if that individual were institutionalized.

(14) Income received by the spouse or dependent family member is counted in calculating the deduction if that type of income is countable to determine Medicaid eligibility. No income disregards are allowed. Certain needs-based income and state supplemental payments are not counted in calculating the deduction. Tribal income is counted.

(15) If the income of a spouse or dependent family member is not reported, no deduction shall be allowed for the spouse or dependent family member.

(16) A client is not given Medicaid coverage if medical costs are not at least equal to the contribution required towards the cost of care.

(17) The standard utility allowance for households with heating costs is \$150. For households without heating costs, actual utility costs are used. The maximum allowance for a telephone bill is \$20. Clients are not required to verify utility costs more than once in a certification period.

(18) Medicaid covered medical costs incurred in a current benefit month cannot be used to meet spenddown when the client is enrolled in an HMO. Bills for mental health services incurred in a benefit month cannot be used to meet spenddown if the client will be eligible for Medicaid and lives in a county which has a single mental health provider under contract with Medicaid to provide services to all Medicaid clients who live in that county. Bills for mental health services received in a retroactive or application month that the client has fully-paid during that time can be used to meet spenddown as long as the services were not provided by the mental health provider in the client's county of residence which is under contract with Medicaid to provide services to all Medicaid clients.

R414-304-8. Budgeting.

(1) The Department adopts 42 CFR 435.601 and 435.640, 1998 ed., which are incorporated by reference. The Department adopts 45 CFR 233.20(a)(3)(iii), 233.31, and 233.33, 1998 ed., which are incorporated by reference.

(2) The following definitions apply to this section:

(a) "Best estimate" means that income is calculated for the upcoming certification period based on current information about income being received, expected income deductions, and household size.

(b) "Prospective eligibility" means that eligibility is determined each month for the immediately following month based on a best estimate of income.

(c) "Prospective budgeting" is the process of calculating income and determining eligibility and spenddown for future months based on the best estimate of income, deductions, and household size.

(d) "Income averaging" means using a history of past income and expected changes, and averaging it over a determined period of time that is representative of future monthly income.

(e) "Income anticipating" means using current facts regarding rate of pay and number of working hours to anticipate future monthly income.

(f) "Income annualizing" means using total income earned during one or more past years, or a shorter applicable time period, and anticipating any future changes, to estimate the average annual income. That estimated annual income is then divided by 12 to determine the household's average monthly income.

(g) "Factoring" means that a monthly amount shall be determined to take into account the months of pay where an individual receives a fifth paycheck when paid weekly or a third paycheck when paid every other week. Weekly income shall be factored by multiplying the weekly amount by 4.3 to obtain a monthly amount. Income paid every other week shall be factored by 2.15 to obtain a monthly amount.

(h) "Reportable income changes" are those that cause income to change by more than \$25. All income changes must be reported for an institutionalized individual.

(3) The Department shall do prospective budgeting on a monthly basis.

(4) A best estimate of income based on the best available information is an accurate reflection of client income in that month.

(5) The Department shall use the best estimate of income to be received or made available to the client in a month to determine eligibility and spenddown.

(6) Methods of determining the best estimate are income averaging, income anticipating, and income annualizing.

(7) The Department shall count income in the following manner:

(a) For QMB, SLMB, QI, and A, B, D, and Institutional Medicaid income shall be counted as it is received. Income that is received weekly or every other week shall not be factored.

(b) For Family Medicaid programs, income that is received weekly or every other week shall be factored.

(8) Lump sums are income in the month received. Any amount of a lump sum remaining after the end of the month of receipt is a resource. Lump sum payments can be earned or unearned income.

(9) Income paid out under a contract is prorated to determine the countable income for each month. Only the prorated amount is used to determine spenddown or eligibility for a month. If the income is received in fewer months than the contract covers, the income is prorated over the period of the contract. If received in more months than the contract covers, the income is prorated over the period of time in which the money is received.

(10) To determine the average monthly income for farm and self-employment income, the Department shall determine the annual income earned during one or more past years, or other applicable time period, and factor in any current changes in expected income for future months. Less than one year's worth of income may be used if this income has recently begun, or a change occurs making past information unrepresentative of future income. The monthly average income shall be adjusted during the year when information about changes or expected changes is received by the Department.

(11) Student income received other than monthly is prorated to determine the monthly countable income. This is done by dividing the total amount by the number of calendar months classes are in session.

(12) Income from Indian trust accounts not exempt by federal law is prorated to determine the monthly countable income when the income varies from month to month, or it is received less often than monthly. This is done by dividing the total amount by the number of months it covers.

(13) Eligibility for retroactive assistance is based on the income received in the month for which retroactive coverage is sought. When income is being prorated or annualized, then the monthly countable income determined using this method is used for retroactive benefit months, except when the income was not being received during, and was not intended to cover, the retroactive months.

R414-304-9. Income Standards.

(1) The Department adopts Sections 1902(a)(10)(E), 1902(l), 1902(m), 1903(f) and 1905(p) of the Compilation of the Social Security Laws, in effect January 1, 1999, which are incorporated by reference.

(2) The Aged and Disabled poverty-related Medicaid income standard is 100% of the federal non-farm poverty guideline. If an Aged or Disabled person's income exceeds this amount the current Medicaid Income Standards (BMS) apply.

(3) The income limit for pregnant women, and children under one year of age, is equal to 133% of the federal poverty guideline for a family of the size involved. If income exceeds this amount, the current Medicaid Income Standards (BMS) apply.

(4) The current Medicaid income standards (BMS) are as follows:

R414-304-10. A, B and D Medicaid, QMB, SLMB, and QI Filing Unit.

(1) The Department adopts 42 CFR 435.601 and 435.602, 1998 ed., which are incorporated by reference. The Department adopts Subsections 1902(l)(1), (2), and (3), 1902(m)(1) and (2), and 1905(p) of the Compilation of the Social Security Laws, in effect January 1, 1999, which are incorporated by reference.

(2) The following individuals are counted in the BMS for A, B and D Medicaid:

- (a) the client;
- (b) a spouse who lives in the same home, if the spouse is eligible for A, B, or D Medicaid;
- (c) a spouse who lives in the same home, if the spouse is also eligible for A, B, or D Medicaid, but has deemable income above the allocation for a spouse.

(3) The following individuals are counted in the BMS for A or D poverty-related Medicaid:

- (a) the client;
- (b) a spouse who lives in the same home, if the spouse is also eligible for A or D Medicaid, regardless of the type of income the spouse receives;
- (c) a spouse who lives in the same home, if the spouse is not eligible for A or D Medicaid, if the spouse has deemable income above the allocation for a spouse.

(4) The following individuals are counted in the BMS for a QMB, SLMB, or QI case:

- (a) the client;
- (b) a spouse living in the same home who receives Part A Medicare or is Aged, Blind, or Disabled;
- (c) a spouse living in the same home who does not receive Part A Medicare and is not Aged, Blind, or Disabled, if the spouse has deemable income above the allocation for a spouse.

(5) Eligibility for A, B and D Medicaid and the spenddown, if any; A and D poverty-related Medicaid; and OMB, SLMB, and QI programs is based on the income of the following individuals:

- (a) the client;
- (b) parents living with the minor client;
- (c) a spouse, if the spouse is counted in the BMS as defined in 2, 3, or 4 of this section.

(6) If a person is "included" in the BMS, it means that family member is counted as part of the household and his or her income and resources are counted to determine eligibility for the household, whether or not that family member receives medical assistance.

R414-304-11. Family Medicaid Filing Unit.

(1) The Department adopts 42 CFR 435.601 and 435.602, 45 CFR 206.10(a)(1)(iii), 233.20(a)(1) and 233.20(a)(3)(vi), 1998 ed., which are incorporated by reference.

(2) Any unemancipated minor child may be excluded from the Medicaid coverage group at the request of the specified relative responsible for the children. An excluded child is considered an

ineligible child and is not counted as part of the BMS for deciding what income limit is applicable to the family. Income and resources of an excluded child are not considered when determining eligibility or spenddown.

(3) The Department shall not use a grandparent's income to determine eligibility or spenddown for a minor child, and the grandparent is not counted in the BMS. A cash contribution from the grandparents received by the minor child or parent of the minor child is countable income.

(4) If anyone in the BMS is pregnant, the unborn child is included in the BMS. If a medical authority confirms that the pregnant woman will have more than one child, all of the unborn children are included in the BMS.

(5) If a child is voluntarily placed in foster care and is in the custody of a state agency, the parents are included in the BMS.

(6) Parents who have relinquished their parental rights are not included in the BMS.

(7) If a court order places a child in the custody of the state, and the child is temporarily placed in an institution, the parents are not included in the BMS.

(8) If a person is "included" in the BMS, it means that family member is counted as part of the household and his or her income and resources are counted to determine eligibility for the household, whether or not that family member receives medical assistance.

R414-304-12. A, B and D Institutional and Waiver Medicaid and Family Institutional Medicaid Filing Unit.

(1) For A, B, and D institutional, and home and community-based waiver Medicaid, the Department shall not use income of the client's parents or the client's spouse to determine eligibility and spenddown.

(2) For Family institutional, and home and community-based waiver Medicaid programs, the Department adopts 45 CFR 206.10(a)(1)(vii), 1998 ed., which is incorporated by reference.

(3) The Department shall base eligibility and spenddown on the income of the client and the sponsor of an alien who is subject to deeming according to the rules described in 20 CFR 416.1166a, 1998 ed., which is incorporated by reference.
